

Ayudas de La Cuaresma


Tenemos que preguntarnos: ¿Cómo me voy en este camino de los 40 días de la Cuaresma? Ya ha pasado una semana y hay posibilidad de algo de cambio. Este tiempo debe ser uno de cambio y conversión. En inglés referimos a este tiempo como Lent. En el inglés de tiempos pasados esta palabra significaba la primavera. Vida nueva empieza; aun por los desechos la vida empieza a empujarse desde las raíces escondidas. En un jardín se necesita trabajo duro ante de sembrar y plantar. También nuestra vida espiritual necesita una primavera nueva para sacar la influencia de pecado, para superar descuido, falta de disciplina, indiferencia, para caminar fielmente con Cristo a su pasión difícil y su muerte en la cruz. Jesús había dicho a sus discípulos que tenían que levantar su cruz y seguirlo. Hemos descubierto que las cruces en nuestras vidas se han puesto demasiado pesadas.

Mejor sería aprender de platicar con Dios íntimamente como un hijo a su padre o como un hermano a su hermano(a) o como un amigo con su amigo.

Puede conversar sobre sus preocupaciones y alegrías, sabiendo que Dios está con usted siempre.

Puede ser que hay un tiempo dificil; pida ayuda para pasar ese tiempo. Puede alabar a Dios quien es grande y hace cosas grandes. También hay tiempos cuando estamos llenos de gracias, y queremos expresar eso en oración.
