My Dear People,


In the first reading of Mass from Exodus, the Hebrews have been rescued from the slavery of the Egyptians and are wandering in the desert on their way to the Promised Land. But soon the scarcity of water makes them regret having followed Moses. God was calling them to embrace their true, spiritual identity and mission in Him, but this would entail looking at things from a spiritual perspective, not only a physical one. It meant trusting God's plan and way for them which also involved sacrifice. Alas, they were willing to return to their captors in Egypt because that, at least, was familiar and gave an illusion of safety.

The Gospel scene of Christ with the Samaritan woman at the well is so rich in meaning that many important lessons can be uncovered, but let me bring out one. Christ is speaking of the living water of grace, while the woman is looking for a source of ordinary water which is more easily accessible than the well she draws from daily. But soon she takes the bait, and sees something greater is at stake.

In the first case, the people just 'don't get it'. Their hard and blind hearts quickly return to the physical comforts of their life of spiritual and physical slavery under the Egyptians, which God had miraculously rescued them from. They wander in the desert for 40 years, not because the trip is so long, but because they refuse to trust, obey, and embrace God's plan. In the case of the Samaritan woman, Our Lord calls her out bluntly on her sinful life, and while for a few moments she resists, she 'takes the plunge', and is willing to let go of both her own ideas and sins, and believe what Christ is offering her. She even becomes an apostle for her entire village!

Far too frequently we all resist 'taking the plunge' and following God's plan for a deeper, truer, better life in Him. So often we prefer to remain in a sort of spiritual slavery, to keep the comforts of a pagan culture around us, a modern day Egypt, rather than letting Our Lord challenge us to see things His way, which might cost, but which will ultimately free us. So often, a small sacrifice makes a huge difference! But we have to trust that God's way, the Church's way, the Gospel's way, Christ's way, will make us happier. The Hebrews wandered in the desert for 40 years, the Samaritan woman was transformed in a few moments and brought others to Jesus within an hour. The difference is trust, courage, and willingness to make a sacrifice. This Lent we have the choice: wander in the desert indefinitely and lament the comforts of Egypt, or follow Jesus in a radical but life changing way. Let me give a helpful hint: the Promised Land is closer than you think.

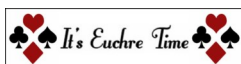
