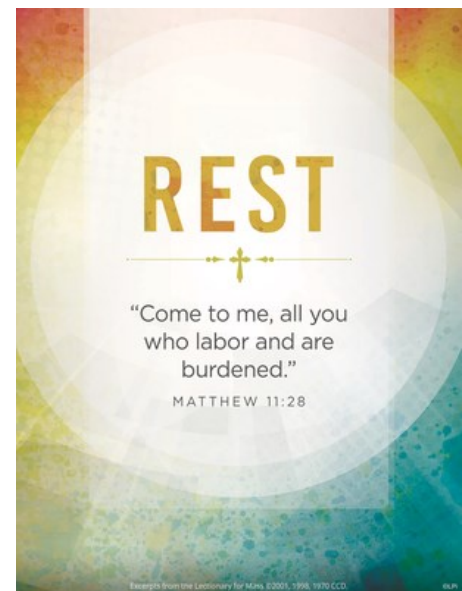

- ⇒ Please remain 6 feet apart from each other. Please sit in open pews.

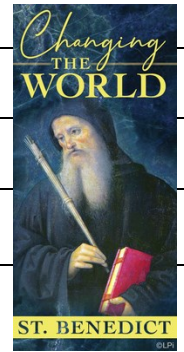


Please don't forget to wear your masks!

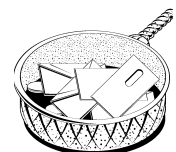

Gospel Reading Matthew 11:25-30

Jesus prays in thanks to God, who has
revealed himself to the lowly.

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches an important lesson
for families: from the youngest and simplest among us
we can learn the most profound insights about God.

Parents who are attentive to this reality can learn
much from their children even as their children are
learning from them. Families who create time and
space for encounters with God will enrich the
faith of all who share in family life.

Gather as a family and read together today's Gospel,
Matthew 11:25-30. Allow time for each person to re-
flect on what Jesus reveals to us about God. Invite
each person to show these things in a creative way,
perhaps through a picture, poem, or some other
means. Share these with one another.

Conclude in prayer together, thank-
ing Jesus for making God known to
us. Pray together the Lord's Prayer or
today's Psalm, Psalm 145.
