

My dear brothers and sisters,


It was around 2 am on Tuesday, July 14th, when a call from my father Michael woke me up from a sound sleep. My mother Margaret had taken a very bad fall, had sustained a serious head injury, and had been rushed to Strong Memorial Hospital. Five days later, she had passed away. Eight days later, I was celebrating her funeral Mass. A little over two weeks later, my father and brother were saying our goodbyes to my sister as she departed to fly back to Alaska. In this short period of time, much had happened and had come to an end: hospital visits, endless conversations with family, friends, doctors, and trusted advisors concerning difficult end-of-life decisions, funeral planning, a funeral, a burial, the redistribution of my mother's personal property, and much more.

Yes, in this short period of time, much had happened and much came to an end. However, some things still remain: sorrow and grief in our family, especially on the part of my father who misses his dear wife of 54 years, a large empty family house in Ontario that we are debating whether or not to sell, the memories of the day and the moment life support was removed from my mother, an experience that, as my sister said at the funeral, had "changed our family forever."

And yet, other things remain: the life and love that my mother gave me and my family, her example as a good person and a good Catholic, and her prayers and spiritual presence. For example, as I write this, I can see to my right, laying on my desk, my mother's prayer book that I will use and cherish for the rest of my life until, Lord willing, I am reunited with her again in heaven. In something so simple as this little prayer book, she remains with me.

And something else remains: the overwhelming love and care of extended family, friends, brother priests, parish staff, and you my parishioners. Your sympathy cards, texts, emails, oral communications, hugs, meals and everything else have been so amazing and life-giving. My family and I can't thank you enough. Up until this point, I have ministered to you all in your many losses and experiences of bereavement. I will continue to do so. However, I will do so now as one who is a fellow mourner, able all the more so to identify with you and be one with you in your sorrows. And in this communion, together we will find hope and peace. Many things pass away on this earth, and yet truth, goodness, and love remain. In this love, we remain united with each other and with our beloved departed whom we can't see anymore but whom we will one day see again. "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord." "And let perpetual light shine upon them." "May they rest in peace." "Amen." "May the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace." "Amen."

¿Estamos Viviendo Nuestra Fe?

Hace algunos años fuimos bautizados en la fe que Jesucristo nos regaló. Fue verdaderamente un regalo; no pagamos nada. Pero nuestros padres prometieron criarnos en la fe que ellos profesaron por responder "sí" a la creencia a las palabras del Credo.

Ojalá que respondamos confiadamente a ese Dios que descubrimos en esta relación e intentemos cumplir su voluntad en nuestras vidas.

Yo diría que la fe es nuestra respuesta a Dios; no solamente un sentimiento o una ideología, sino una manera de relacionarnos a Dios. "Aquí estoy, mi Dios." Family Promise Volunteers Needed

Family Promise of Wayne County is a non-profit organization that exists to help families with children experiencing temporary homelessness find permanent housing and achieve sustainability. FPWC has been in existence since October 2018. As a local affiliate of the national Family Promise with over 200 Affiliates in 43 states, 18 families and 35 children have transitioned through our program as of July 2020.

A network of local host congregations provides overnight shelter, dinner meals and hospitality to up to four guest families comprising no more that 14 individuals. During the day, families leave the congregation and use the Day Resource Center in Lyons where professional staff offer case management and resources. Shower and laundry facilities are available at the Day Resource Center. Hosting rotates among 10-13 congregations and families in the program stay at each congregation for a week at a time, usually four times a year. An average length of stay for a family in the programs is 50 days.

During these days of the COVID-19 pandemic Family Promise has alternatively provided short term apartment rentals where families are "sheltering in place." Host congregations are continuing to provide dinner meals, other food items, and creative hospitality.

St. Michael's, along with other local churches, hopes to build a strong base of volunteers who are willing to help provide meals for these families in need. We are scheduled to host for the first time starting, Sunday, 9/13, for one week.
