#### ¿Cómo Vivimos Nuestros Compromisos?

Normalmente a mediados de agosto cada año como una Hermana de la Misericordia el 14 de agosto hace muchos años cuando yo era tan joven. He crecido en mi vida, en mi conocimiento de Dios, en mi relación con Dios, en mi espíritu de compromiso y dedicación al ministerio. Espero que por medio de mi oración diaria y mi retiro anual yo pueda profundizar por lo menos un poco esa relación con Dios y también por las reuniones y talleres que tenemos como una congregación todas podamos comprometernos más a vivir nuestro compromiso de servicio a los demás.

Cada seis años tenemos una reunión con representantes del Instituto de todas las Américas con el propósito de ver qué podemos hacer en el presente para servir a la Iglesia, los pobres, los necesitados, los enfermos, los que sufren por falta de justicia y los que necesitan más educación. En la reunión de 2017 hubo un nuevo compromiso de fortalecer nuestras relaciones entre nosotras hermanas y de abrazar de nuevo nuestras preocupaciones críticas a través de la lente de la no violencia. Estas preocupaciones nos impulsan a: (1) crecer en la práctica personal de la no violencia y colaborar con organizaciones y comunidades que promueven la paz, y trabajar para cambiar sistemas y estructuras de violencia. (2) trabajar hacia la sostenibilidad de toda la vida, cuidando los ecosistemas de la tierra, abordando el cambio climático, abogando por el derecho al agua limpia, y comprometiéndonos a una conversión ecológica. (3) continuar nuestro compromiso para eliminar racismo personal, comunitaria e institucional y trabajar para eliminar estructuras y políticas que oprimen, (4) abogar por el valor intrínseco de la vida de las mujeres y promover la igualdad de las mujeres en la Iglesia y la sociedad, (5) estar en solidaridad con refugiados, migrantes, inmigrantes y victimas de la trata de personas, trabajando con ellos por un mundo más justo e inclusivo.

Todo esto puso más énfasis en lo que hace nueve años habíamos aceptado. Ahora en 2020 me encuentro preguntándome: "Kay, ¿cómo te va en esto? ¿Lo estás haciendo un paso adelante y tomando algunos pasos positivos?"

Creo que cada uno de nosotros debe mirar nuestros compromisos, reflexionar sobre cómo estamos viviéndolos, y renovar

nuestros compromisos. Ahora es la hora. No es demasiado tarde, pero no demoren.

### Family Ministry

Gospel Reading Matthew 15:21-28 Jesus heals the daughter of the Canaanite woman because of her great faith.

Even when spurned by Jesus, the faith of the Canaanite woman makes her bold enough to argue and ask again for what she needs. Her persistence and great confidence that Jesus could heal her daughter reminds us of the confidence with which our children bring to us their own needs. In their faith and trust we can find modern examples of how we God approach

As a family recall some times when a request for something was presented by one family member to another with confidence and persistence. If the request was denied, talk about why that was so. If the request was eventually granted, talk about what led to the change of heart. Then read together to-day's Gospel, Matthew 15:21-28. Was anyone surprised by Jesus' response to the Canaanite woman? Why or why not? What makes Jesus change his mind and heal the woman's daughter? When we pray, God wants us to be as confident in his mercy. Invite family members to identify the things that they most need from God. Pray these prayers of petition together as a family, confident that God will hear and answer your prayers.
