Fidelidad a Dios; Semejantes a Cristo

¿A quién se refiere el título anterior? Espero a cada uno de nosotros en nuestros esfuerzos para seguir a Cristo. Algunos días podemos estar muy semejantes a Cristo y otros días tan lejos de ser como Cristo. Intentamos ser fieles a Dios, pero a veces nuestra naturaleza humana nos lleva a otra manera de vivir, de reaccionar, de responder a ciertas situaciones y a ciertas personas. En un instante podemos cambiar de ser Sr. Hombre Bueno a ser Sr. Hombre Desagradable. ¿Por qué no podemos realmente amar a todas las personas, no importa cómo nos tratan?

Hay una variedad de personas que han sido reconocidas por la Iglesia como santos, y aun han sido canonizados oficialmente por el papa. Ya tenemos miles de personas que pueden servir como modelos de santidad. Quizás ustedes han descubierto alguien que capta su atención por la manera en que vivían, cómo respondieron a Dios por su oración, cómo expresaron compasión a personas en necesidad, cómo compartían el evangelio, cómo expresaban el amor de Dios, cómo mantenían su fidelidad a Dios y al pueblo de Dios. Una cosa atrae la atención de alguien que no toca a otra persona. Hay muchas maneras por las cuales los santos vivían que les ayudaba a ellos encontrar a Cristo profundamente.

La cosa mas importante es que encontraron a Cristo íntimamente, llegaron a conocer a Cristo y dejarlo guiarlos en sus vidas y hacer el bien para los demás. Dios se extiende a nosotros cada día, pero tenemos que aceptarlo, comunicarnos con Dios, mostrar el amor. En este tiempo de la pandemia he visto varias películas sobre los santos—cada santo es diferente y único, y tan deseoso para hacer lo correcto, la voluntad de Dios y ser fiel a Dios. Cada uno me ha dado una chispa de saber lo que es importante en la vida cristiana. No es solamente por su enseñanza, sino su ejemplo de vida que nosotros podemos palpar su santidad.

Seamos casados, solteros, sacerdotes o religiosos, tenemos una llamada de Dios para seguirlo. Ninguna vocación es mejor que la otra; lo que es importante es que escuchemos la voz en nuestro interior que nos guía a aceptar la llamada y seguir la voz



de Dios durante toda la vida, aprovechando todas las ayudas que Dios nos ofrece. Ciertamente la celebración de la Eucaristía es una ayuda recibimos la Palabra de Dios y también el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo para alimentarnos de mente y de espíritu. ¡Tan importante es la oración! *Hna. Kay*

Gospel Reading Matthew 16: 21-27

Jesus speaks of his Passion and rebukes Peter for his objection. Peter was expecting a Messiah that would Carry out a different plan than the one Jesus had explained. Jesus was indeed the Messiah, but his life and death would show a different understanding of what it means to be the Messiah. We too have expectations of God and our own ideas about what we think God ought to be doing in our world. Like Peter we may risk limiting our image of God by thinking only in human ways. God's plan is always more than we Can ever imagine.

As you gather as a family, talk about what we expect God to be doing in our world and in our family life. Then read today's Gospel, Matthew 16:21-27. Why do you think Peter was so upset by what Jesus was saying? Notice how Jesus reprimands Peter. Do we sometimes forget to let God be God for us? That is, do we sometimes get discouraged because God doesn't act in our world in the ways that we expect? Pray together that your family will remember that God is always working for the world's salvation in ways that are beyond our human imaginings. Conclude by praying together today's Psalm, Psalm 63.
