He ascended into Heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God, the Father almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead.

These beautiful words from the Apostles Creed, express the astounding reality that forty days after Jesus rose triumphantly from the grave on that first Easter Sunday, he gathered his disciples around him and was lifted up from their sight into heaven. And this was not an illusion! He actually, physically rose into the heavens before their eyes. So we read in the Acts of the Apostles that *as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight.*

While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven." It reminds me of children at a carnival who have lost their balloon!

They keep looking for it even after they can's see it any more and their parents have to distract them, snap them out of it. Of course that's how the disciples felt, how they acted! No wonder God had to send two angels to snap them out of it! But, what does it tell us? Well, first of all, Jesus is not just a disembodied spirit. No! True God from true God. He also remains the man who was born of the Virgin and who forever intercedes for us at the Father's right hand. His work is not finished until He shall come to judge the living and the dead. And what did he tell the disciples before he ascended? I am with you always! The Ascension and the Seating at the Right Hand are so important but they can get forgotten, overwhelmed by Good Friday, by Easter, and by Pentecost. Don't let that happen in your life! Jesus lives forever and he is interceding FOR YOU at his Father's right hand. He is your advocate in heaven and... are you ready for this?.... He has prepared a place FOR YOU! The disciples couldn't stop looking up as Jesus ascended into heaven. Well, it's time for us all to LOOK UP! Keep the eternal perspective. Do not get so distracted by earthly cares and fears that you lose sight of your eternal destiny, that you lose sight of THE ON-LY ONE WHO CAN SAVE YOU - OF THE ONE WHO DIED FOR YOU! Jesus Christ, God and Man, awaits you, prays for you, calls you to give him your heart, your life, so that you can live forever! Amen! Deacon Kiley

Family Connection

Gospel Reading: John 17:11b-19 Jesus prays for his disciples.

One of the greatest gifts that we are given in our family life is protection from harm. Families work together to keep one another safe from physical harm. Think of the effort a family makes to childproof its home for infants and toddlers. Families also work together to protect each other from emotional harm. For example, we attend to the ways in which family members talk to one another so that we do not hurt one another's feelings by our words. Most importantly, families work together to protect each other from those things that might harm them spiritually. We shield our Children from those things in our Culture that might tempt them. When families work together to strengthen their sense of God and Community, they build the spiritual strength to turn from those things that would lead them away from God and the Church. Jesus' prayer for his disciples can also be a prayer for family life.

Gather as a family and talk about the things that you want most for each other. Talk about the fact that as we work toward these things, we also work to protect one another from harmful things. What do you want to protect each other from? Observe that in today's Gospel, Jesus shows these same two tendencies as he prays for something he wants for his disciples and prays for their protection as well. Read together today's Gospel, John 17:11b-19. Consider what Jesus wants for his disciples and what Jesus wants to protect his disciples from. We know that when Jesus prayed for his disciples, he was praying for us as well. We pray for these things as well, for example, when

we pray the Lord's Prayer. Conclude by praying together the Lord's Prayer



THE LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.
