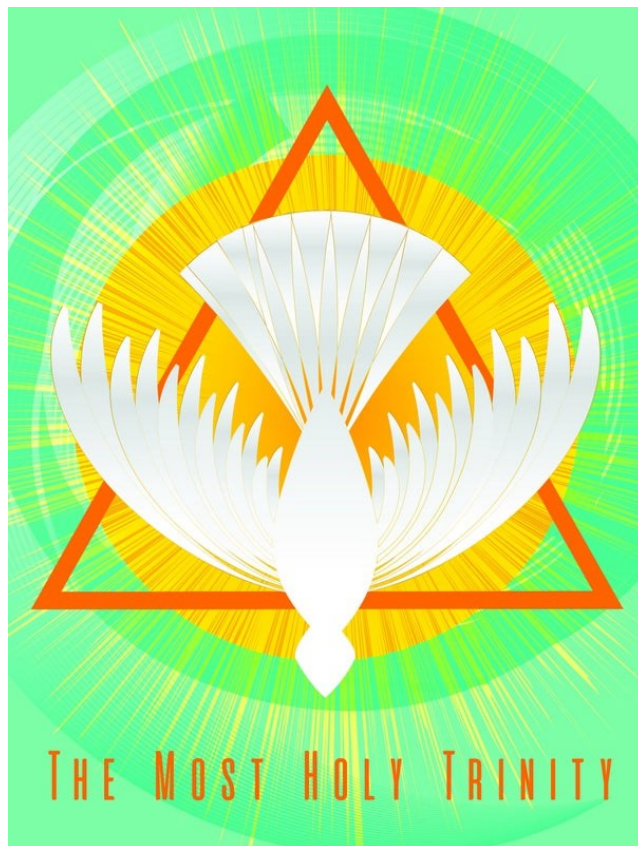

## ¡Ah, Tan Grande Es el Amor de Dios!

Hoy, por la fiesta de la Santísima Trinidad estamos reconociendo y celebrando el hecho que Dios es una comunión del amor relacional. Para los de Israel en el tiempo de la biblia ningún otro dios pudo comparar con su Dios quien fue creador y liberador y quien estaba actuando constantemente en sus vidas y en su historia. No hubo ningún otro dios como el suyo. Pero, no solamente Dios estaba en sus vidas dándose a ellos, sino ellos a la vez estaban aceptando las responsabilidades de los mandamientos que Dios dio a ellos y los descendientes de ellos.

Los primeros cristianos recibieron una tarea--lo que Mateo escribió al final de su evangelio--que tenían que ir a otras naciones, bautizándolos en el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. En los primeros siglos los cristianos lentamente estaban desarrollando su fe en un lenguaje trinitario: Dios es una comunión de amor. Eventualmente llamaban esa enseñanza la doctrina de un Dios trino y en el Concilio de Constantinopla en 551 usaron la palabra Trinidad para expresar el Dios trino.

Escuchamos hoy en el evangelio que este Dios trino va a estar con nosotros hasta el fin del mundo. No debemos hablar de la ausencia de este Dios de amor, este Dios en el cual las tres personas se relacionan por una comunión de amor. Nosotros entramos en ese amor y ese Dios de amor entra en nosotros. Dios está con nosotros como Mateo había escrito de Emanuel al principio de su evangelio. Hoy en día este Dios de amor está con nosotros de otra manera, no por medio de la persona humana de Jesús, sino por la presencia de la Trinidad: Dios el Creador, Dios Espíritu Santo que nos ayuda crecer por medio de tantos dones y por el Cristo cósmico que había participado en la obra creadora, como también en la obra redentora y santificadora. Por la resurrección de Cristo se abre paso a la resurrección de cada uno de nosotros y la redención de la creación.

Existe Dios hoy en un movimiento cíclico de amor tan fantástico porque Dios nos reúne en este movimiento. Dios está cerca; Dios está adentro de nosotros. En esta fiesta de la Trinidad celebramos no solo el misterio de Dios sino la cercanía de Dios que sigue invitándonos a entrar al ciclo de la vida y el amor—una invitación que es no solo para los seres humanos sino para todo el cosmos.

Cuando van persigándose piensen en el significado de esta acción simbólica de nuestros bautismos y pongan atención a la vida divina que habita dentro de ustedes y en el cual nosotros tenemos el privilegio de habitar.

## Family Connection

### Gospel Reading: Matthew 28:16-20

Jesus sends his disciples to make disciples of all nations.

The Solemnity of the Holy Trinity invites us to remember that God has revealed himself to us as one God in three Persons. As Jesus departed from his disciples, he shared with them the power to make disciples of all nations. He taught his disciples to invite others to share in the life of the blessed Trinity by sharing with others the gift of Baptism. This continues to be the mission of the Church. Each of us who has been baptized shares in the life of the blessed Trinity and also shares in the Church's mission of inviting others to share in God's love.

As you gather as a family, bring out pictures and other mementos of family celebrations of the Sacrament of Baptism. Talk about the significance of Baptism with your family. Read together today's Gospel, Matthew 28:16-20. Notice that Jesus taught his disciples to baptize all nations in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. What else does this remind you of? (the Sign of the Cross) Recall that whenever we pray the Sign of the Cross, we are reminding ourselves that we are united with God through our Baptism and share in the life of the blessed Trinity. Conclude by thanking God for sharing his life with us.

Pray together the Glory Be to the Father.

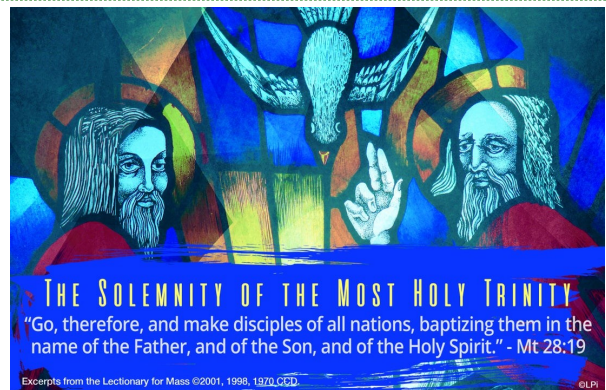
