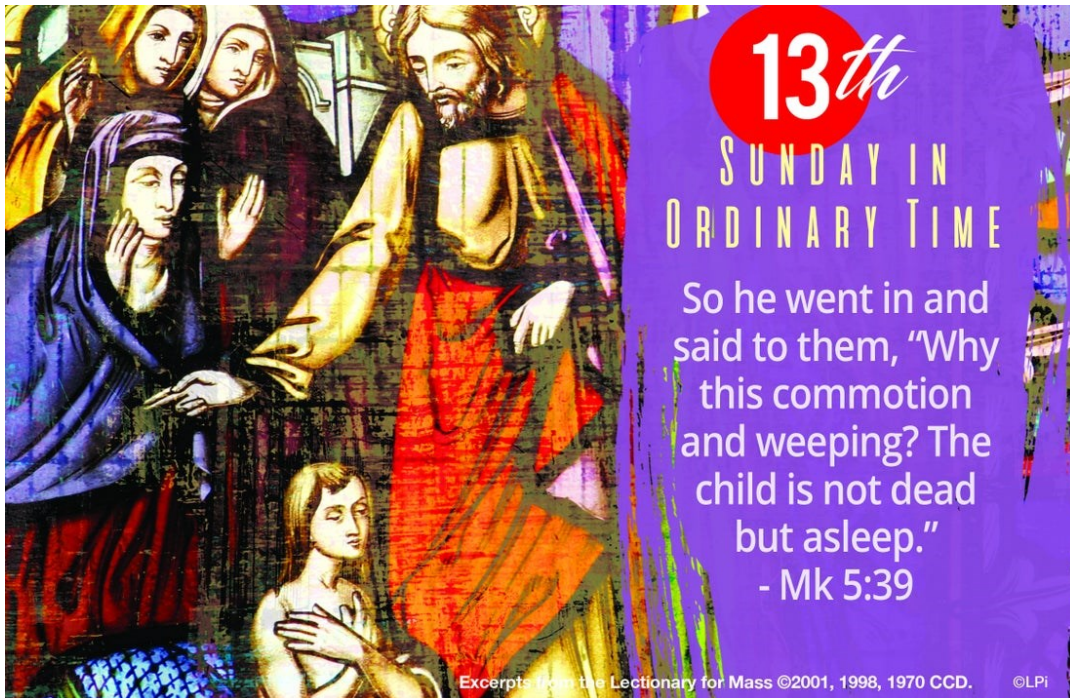

**Nuestra Celebración los Domingos**

Cuando yo era una niña la familia Schwenzer iba a la iglesia todos los domingos. Allí oramos todos juntos, pero en ese tiempo las oraciones de la Misa fueron en latín. Teníamos libros personales que contenían las oraciones; una página tenía el texto en latín y la pagina opuesta tenía el mismo texto en inglés. Menos mal porque no entendí el latín hasta que yo estaba en la escuela secundaria y yo empecé a estudiar el latín. Ciertamente el latín no tiene la fluidez para comunicarse usándolo.

Yo usé la palabra *Misa* al referir al sacramento que celebramos porque hoy en día la mayoría de la gente usa ese término. Realmente ese término hace referencia a lo que es nuestra misión al final de la celebración. El sacerdote nos envía a una misión de vivir y compartir lo que celebramos. Pero hay varios términos para describir este sacramento magnífico. Es la *celebración eucarística* o sea el sacramento de la *Eucaristía* que de verdad es la fuente y cima de toda la vida cristiana. Eucaristía significa *acción de gracias*. Damos gracias a Dios por este Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo que nos alimentan espiritualmente, y también por la creación y santificación. Espero por celebrar juntos estamos un poco más conscientes de la presencia de Dios en nuestras vidas que nos anima a una transformación.

Otro nombre es *banquete del Señor* porque se trata de la Última Cena que Jesucristo celebró con sus discípulos la noche antes de morir. La oración larga y la preparación de los dones y la consagración de la celebración están hechos en una mesa—la mesa del banquete. Otro nombre es *Fracción del pan* porque Jesús como el sacerdote hoy tomó el pan, lo bendijo, partió el pan y lo entregó a los discípulos. Presta atención a P. Jesús cuando antes de la Comunión él toma en sus manos la hostia y parte en alto la hostia y después dice, “Este es el Cordero de Dios, que quita el pecado del mundo. Dichosos los invitados a la Cena del Señor.” Esta fracción del pan significa que todos los que comen de este único pan partido, que es Cristo, entran en comunión con él y forman un solo cuerpo en él.

A veces usamos el termino *Santo Sacrificio* o *santo sacrificio de la misa* porque actualiza el único sacrificio de Cristo. El sacerdote nos dice ante de distribuir la Comunión, “Este es el Cordero de Dios,” quien es Jesucristo. Los corderos fueron sacrificados encima de altares en el Antigua Testamento. Por eso llamamos la mesa del banquete también un altar en nuestras iglesias. Nuestra celebración es ambos un banquete y un sacrificio.

Nuestra celebración comunitaria los domingos de a poco nos acerca más. *Hermana Kay*



## Family Connection

### Gospel Reading: Mark 5:21-43

Jesus heals a woman afflicted with a hemorrhage and raises Jairus's daughter from death.

There are many ways in which we can compare the request for healing made by Jairus and the request of the woman with the hemorrhage. One comparison helps us think about prayer. Jairus asked Jesus for healing on his daughter's behalf; the woman with the hemorrhage had no one to speak for her and bravely approached Jesus on her own initiative. In our prayers, we do both. We intercede for others' needs, and we also courageously express our own needs to God. We find hope in Jesus' response to both of these people, who sought him out in their hour of need. As you gather as a family, talk about some of the things you have prayed for this week. Notice that some of your prayers may have been for other people, and some of your prayers may have been for your own needs. In today's Gospel we find encouragement for both kinds of prayer. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 5:21-43. Talk about the similarities and differences between the two people who presented their needs to Jesus in this Gospel. Notice that both people received the healing they sought from Jesus. We want to pray for the needs of others and for our own needs with as much faith and hope as Jairus and the woman with the hemorrhage did. Pray together in thanks and praise to God, who hears our needs and answers them, by praying today's psalm, Psalm 30.
