

"I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." Mt 6.35

The crowd did not seek Jesus for His great signs and wonders which they had seen, but because they had eaten for free, without effort and work. But those who ate should have been concerned not about the mundane food which perishes, but for the food which endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man would give them. They did not understand Him. They thought it was a magic food, which would satisfy them for a long time and would not have to be consumed daily. Therefore, Jesus answered them: "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry; and he who believes in me will never thirst."

Many were scandalized by His words and went away. They did not believe Him. And after a time. He fulfilled His promise. On the eve of His Passion, at the Last Supper, He instituted the Eucharist and commanded the Apostles and their successors to do the same thing, and they believed in Jesus and fulfilled the command.

And we? Do we really believe that He is here with us in the Blessed Sacrament? Do you remember when you go to church? He is truly alive and present but hidden under the appearance of bread. So, strive to remember this when you go to the house of God. Then kneel down if you can and confess faith in the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, saving: "Praised be the Blessed Sacrament, now and ever and always. Amen."

And then tell the Lord Jesus that you believe in His presence here and that you love him more than anything and regret your weaknesses and sins.

Let us be faithful to the Sunday Eucharist. With great faith and respect, let us take part in it and never let us to neglect so great a Savior.

Family Connection

Gospel Reading: John 6:24-35

Jesus teaches the crowds that he is the "bread of life." In today's Gospel, the Crowd asks Jesus for a sign so that they can believe that he has come from God. This is a Curious request, because Jesus has just fed more than 5000 people with just five barley loaves and two fish. How quickly they seem to have forgotten the wonderful thing that Jesus has done for them. Or, maybe they never recognized the miracle in the first place. Sometimes we don't recognize the wonderful things that God has done for us. And, sometimes, we simply forget and ask for further evidence of his love and Care. We pray that God will remove our blindness so that we can receive with thanks and praise all the wonderful things that God accomplishes in our lives. Together as a family, name the wonderful gifts that God has given you and some of the remarkable deeds that God has accomplished in our world. Observe that it is important to stop to count our blessings because we can easily miss recognizing all of the wonderful things that God does for us. Read together today's Gospel, John 6:24-35. Ask: Why are the people seeking out Jesus? (because he has fed them) What do they want from Jesus? (a sign that he has come from God) What does Jesus tell them? (He says that he will give them something greater and more important than the bread that fed their physical hungers; he will give them bread that will give them eternal life.) Recall that we have this gift from Jesus in the Eucharist. Pray together, thanking God for all that he has given to us, especially for the gift of eternal life and the Eucharist. Pray together the Magnificat.

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior; for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name. He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm, he has scattered the proud in their conceit.

He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he has remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever.

"Yo Soy el Pan de la Vida"

Mucha gente había conocido a Jesús por medio de sus sanaciones, las expulsiones de los demonios y algunos más por la multiplicación de los panes y pescados. Lo seguían y puede ser que quisieran ver más milagros o más pan; estando cerca de él iban a poder comer sin trabajar mucho. No entendían lo que todo eso significaba. Le preguntaron a Jesús, "¿Qué necesitamos para llevar a cabo las obras de Dios?" Supieron que Moisés y los otros hebreos comieron maná en el desierto, pero sin entender que no fue Moisés que había dado el pan del cielo, sino fue Dios. Así es en nuestras vidas; Dios nos da todo.

¿Qué necesitamos para poder entender lo que nosotros debemos hacer como cristianos en nuestro mundo y en nuestro tiempo? Ciertamente tenemos que estar abiertos a la acción de Dios en nuestras vidas; necesitamos escuchar la Palabra de Dios para conocer a Jesús y para escuchar lo que Él nos enseña. También tenemos que alimentarnos espiritualmente del cuerpo y de la sangre de Jesucristo-el pan de la vida-el pan eucarístico. Jesús dice que la gente que "viene a mí no tendrá hambre y el que cree en mí nunca tendrá sed." Tener fe en Jesús es esencial: vivir de su Palabra y de su cuerpo y sangre. Esto refiere a la Eucaristía: verdaderamente su cuerpo y su sangre son para comer y beber. Si realmente creemos en Jesucristo-su persona, sus enseñanzas y el sacramento que El nos dejó, vamos a recibir mucha vida—espiritualmente no vamos a tener hambre y sed. Tendremos lo esencial y eventualmente veremos que el hambre y la sed natural, y la muerte no son tan importantes. Nuestra verdadera felicidad y vida vienen de Dios.

Si creemos en Jesucristo y sus enseñanzas y vivimos su misión, aceptaremos a todas otras personas con amor como hermanos y hermanas. Este grupo de creyentes estará unido en paz y amor en comunidad intentando servir uno al otro. No habrá violencia, guerra, injusticias, falta de respeto verdad y honestidad. Necesitamos comer de Cristo más y más, reconociendo nuestra falta de dignidad de recibir a Dios dentro de nosotros, pero dejando a El penetrarnos y cambiarnos. "Oh, Dios Jesucristo fortalece nuestra fe en ti para que seamos mejores cristianos cada día." Hermana Kay
