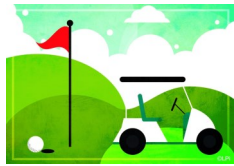


**RENOVATION NEWS...**

### ¿A Quién y Cómo Servimos?

Hoy en la lectura del libro de Josué, después de reunir a la gente en la presencia del Señor, Josué les hace la pregunta: "... digan aquí y ahora a quién quieren servir." Llegó el tiempo cuando tenían que ver lo que estaban haciendo y lo que el pueblo de Israel se comprometió hacer hace tantos años. Josué respondió que su familia y él iban a servir al Señor, el único Dios de Israel, el Dios que los rescataron hace tiempo—no los dioses falsos de otros pueblos. Por hacerles la pregunta, él quería que ellos renovaran su alianza con el único Señor de Israel.

¿Cómo sirve a Dios? No es sólo por tirarse ante él en oración todo el día. Sí, la oración y adoración son importantes, pero nuestro Dios de amor quiere que extendamos el amor hacia otras personas. Es importante pensar en otras personas y sus necesidades. Tan fácil es pensar en todo de sí mismo y su propia familia y después si le queda un poco de tiempo, quizás pueda ayudar a otras por un tiempo. Nuestras acciones y obras deben mostrar qué y quién es importante. Josué vio que habían salido del camino de su único Dios y estaban dependiendo de dioses que ellos mismos habían hecho.

Es como hoy en día a veces estamos admirados por lo que hacemos—cosas materiales y frecuentemente las cosas materiales nos llevan más lejos de Dios. Puede ser que siempre estemos pensando en la vida en términos de lo material. Yo tengo dinero por eso la vida me va bien, o me falta dinero por eso la vida es miserable. O quizás está siempre buscando el amor del otro, sea el esposo, o la esposa, el hijo(a), un hermano (a), o un amigo(a), y no está satisfecho con lo que la vida le ofrece. Dios está presente y lo espera a usted responder a lo que Dios le ofrece. ¿Se da cuenta de la presencia de Dios en su vida? ¿de la acción de Dios en su vida?

Jesucristo nos enseñó el camino de cómo servir a Dios. Hay que leer los evangelios cuidadosamente para ver como actuaba Jesús. El camino de la pobreza, la obediencia, la compasión, el amor, el servicio, el perdón y la humildad son maneras de servir a Dios.

## Family Connection

**Gospel Reading:** John 6:60-69

Simon Peter confesses his faith that Jesus alone has the words of the eternal life.

When a child is baptized, the parents speak on behalf of the child in professing the faith in which the child is to be baptized. The parents promise to teach their child this faith so that they may one day accept this faith as his or her own. In the example of Simon Peter, we learn that each person must also make his or her own profession of faith in Jesus as the one sent by God to save us. We pray for our children as they mature in the faith that they may learn that Jesus alone has the words of eternal life and that they may choose to follow the way of Christian discipleship.

As you gather as a family, talk about promise that parents make at their child's baptism to teach their child about Jesus and the faith of the Church. Talk about the importance of this promise to your family and about some of the things that you are doing to try to honor this commitment. In today's Gospel we hear Simon Peter speak about what he has come to believe about Jesus. Together read today's Gospel, John 6:60-69. Pray together that each person in our family will grow in his or her faith that Jesus is the one sent by God who alone has the words of eternal life. Pray together the Apostles' Creed or the Nicene Creed.
