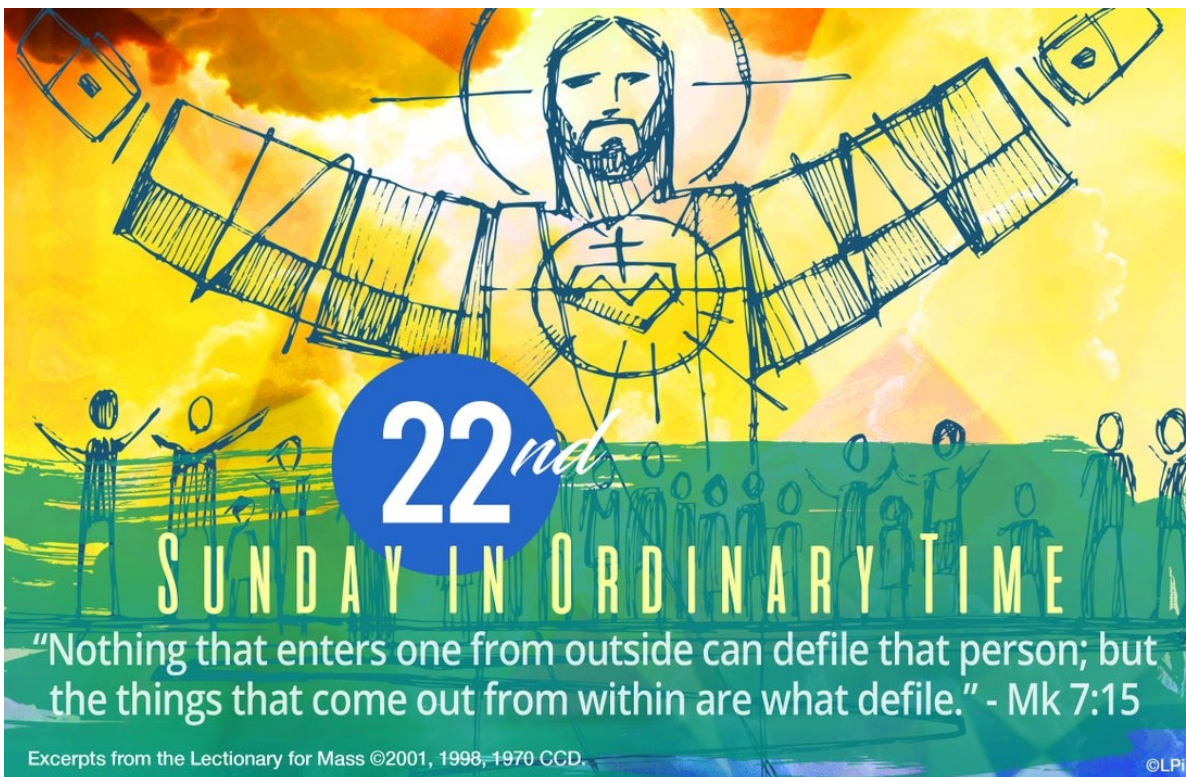

There will be updates added to the bulletin as our renovation project progresses. Thank you for your continued support and prayers while our renovation is under way.

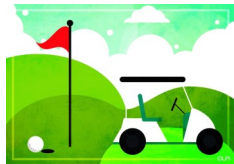

## Influencia de un Santo en Su País

Este 18 de agosto, siendo la fiesta de San Alberto Hurtado, un sacerdote jesuita chileno, estoy pensando en años atrás al pasar por un pueblito conocido como Padre Hurtado cuando yo estaba viviendo en Chile y después los contactos míos con su gran obra de Hogar de Cristo. El gobierno chileno en 1994 nombró una comuna del área metropolitana de Santiago en honor de P. Hurtado un poco antes de su beatificación por la Iglesia católica, y en 2005 un poco después de su canonización nombró una estación del metro subterráneo por él. ¡Qué respeto y honor tienen Chile y los chilenos por haber tenido Padre Hurtado trabajando en solidaridad por el bien de los desamparados de Chile y por ser reconocido por la Iglesia universal al declararlo oficialmente *Santo* por el Papa Benedicto XVI! Él fue solamente el segundo santo chileno de la Iglesia católica.

Alberto Hurtado fue un abogado y legislador por un tiempo ante de estudiar para ser sacerdote. Él es patrón de los trabajadores en Chile; él había abogado por ellos y escribió sobre sus derechos y la importancia de formar sindicatos. Él siempre estaba pensando en maneras de estar en solidaridad con los desamparados. Para él fue tan importante tratar al vecino como un verdadero hermano, pero especialmente quería levantar a los pobres y necesitados, organizando servicios para los muchos grupos necesitados, y animando a otros manejar esos servicios. En los desamparados Padre Hurtado veía el rostro de Cristo. Los chilenos empezaron a llamarlo el cura de los pobres. También Padre Hurtado fundó la revista jesuita *Mensaje* para orientar al lector, los que tenían más educación e influencia, hacia una ideología y ética cristiana dentro del contexto de la realidad nacional, mundial y cultural privilegiando la problemática de la situación de los más vulnerables de la sociedad. Quería abrir los ojos de todos a las necesidades de los pobres.

Varias veces yo tenía la oportunidad de ir al Hogar de Cristo donde los con pocos recursos económicos pudieron conseguir ayuda de salud, de comestibles, y de casas. También tenía hospedería a los sin casa, lugares para enfermos terminales, para ancianos, desvalidos y los con adicciones. El Hogar hacía casas prefabricadas a un precio mas posible para los que tenían poco dinero. Las hermanas de mi comunidad religiosa y los de la comunidad del sector donde yo vivía compramos del Hogar de Cristo las paredes y todo lo que necesitábamos para construir una capilla en el sector de la parroquia donde vivimos para nuestros servicios dominicales y nuestras reuniones durante la semana. Los hombres de la comunidad la construyeron y con mucho orgullo pudimos dar culto dentro de ella.

Tengo un gran respeto por Padre Hurtado y todo lo que él hizo por Chile. 18 de agosto los chilenos pueden recordar de una manera especial a un gran hombre de fe y logros. Que cada uno

de nosotros haga algo para estar en solidaridad con nuestros hermanos (as) en su necesidad.

## Family Connection

**Gospel Reading:** Mark 7:1-8,14-15,21-23

Jesus teaches that it is that which comes from our hearts that defiles us.

Children have learned the importance of following rules. Like the Pharisees in today's Gospel, they often bring to our attention the infractions of others. Even parents sometimes get caught off guard by their children's observations: "Why don't you have to go to bed at 8:00?" or "But I saw you eat a cupcake before breakfast once." Our rules for our children are not arbitrary. We establish and enforce family rules with the intention of helping our children grow to be healthy and mature adults. We foster this maturity when we also initiate conversations with our children about the purposes behind family rules and teach them the essential values that rules help us observe.

As you gather as a family, list some of your most important family rules. Together, try to write a single, positive statement that captures the essential value behind your family rules. In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus criticize the Pharisees for making their rules about ritual purity equal to the commandments of God's Law. Read today's Gospel, Mark 7:1-8,14-15,21-23. When we remember the essential element behind our rules, we see that our rules help us be the good people that Jesus wants us to be. Conclude in prayer together that we may always honor God's Law in our words and deeds. Pray together today's psalm, Psalm 15.
