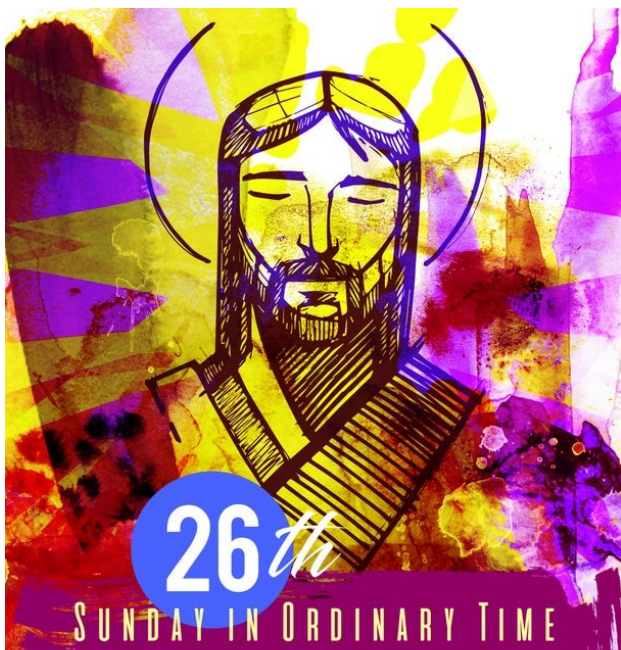

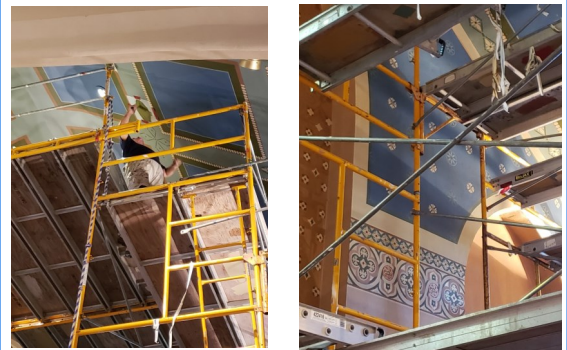

### Oración Es Mas que Hablar

Algunos de nosotros somos muy buenos hablando y quizás mas o menos escuchando. Igual en la oración--tenemos tantas cosas para decir a Dios y no tomamos el tiempo para escucharle. Piénsalo, cuando éramos niños aprendemos rezos: algo antes de acostarnos, otro rezo ante de comer, otros al levantarnos en la mañana. Mas tarde aprendimos el Padre Nuestro y lo rezamos con toda la asamblea durante la Misa. Así aprendemos orar usando las palabras del otro o hablando nuestras palabras espontáneamente a Dios. Para las personas extravertidas la oración espontanea fue fácil, pero para los callados e introvertidos esto fue difícil. ¿Qué va a decir a Dios? No es como mi buen amigo quien yo conozco bien y con quien me siento muy cómodo y a quien puedo ver. Dios es más grande y no puedo verlo. ¿Qué puedo decir a Dios? Me siento un poco extraño hablándole. ¿Por qué hacerlo? El ya sabe todo lo que voy a decir.

Aunque Dios ya sabe los problemas, los logros, las alegrías y las situaciones no resueltas, Dios quiere que admitamos todo eso a nosotros mismos y que realmente necesitamos la ayuda de Dios para resolverlos. Dios siempre está en nuestras vidas para ayudar. Pero ¿qué valor hay en comunicar un problema si no vamos a escuchar la respuesta? De nuevo, la escucha es importante y necesario.

La oración no es solamente hablar a Dios; también es escuchar a Dios. Para hacer eso, tenemos que ponernos en un ambiente de silencio para abrirnos a Dios a través de nuestros sentidos y nuestro corazón. Dejen la salida del sol, la puesta de sol, las nubes, las estrellas, un bebé, las olas del mar, la luna, los árboles, etc. llevarlos a Dios sin decir ninguna palabra. En el medio del silencio puede ser que vayan a sentir algo tan fuerte muy adentro en el fondo de su corazón. En lo más profundo del silencio está la maravillosa consciencia de la presencia de Dios—Dios que ama y perdona y es siempre cerca y listo para ser solidario y alentador, listo para ayudar.

En esencia, la oración de escuchar es oración contemplativa. Es simplemente una oración sin palabras que guía a la persona a esa presencia de amor que siempre es presente. Oración es una confianza simple en esa presencia del Divino. Nos pide abrirnos más y más a su presencia.

Intenten una oración de escuchar de vez en cuando y descubren su corazón llenarse de Dios—un corazón lleno de amor, de alegría, de la gloria y las maravillas de Dios. Dios misterioso y maravilloso, te alabamos y te damos gracias. Ayúdanos a poder abrirnos a ti siempre. Toca nuestros corazones y cambia nuestras maneras de vivir para que otros puedan verte por medio de nuestras acciones. *Hermana Kay*

## Family Connection

**Gospel Reading:** Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48

Jesus teaches that whoever is not against him is for him.

The second part of today's Gospel contains a strong message for those who share the responsibility of fostering faith. It is indeed an awesome responsibility. Today's Gospel reminds us that faith is a lifelong journey toward God. We don't always get it all or even get it right. But we pray for the grace to acknowledge and build upon even the smallest signs of faith, in ourselves and in others. There are plenty of obstacles that might prevent the growth of faith. Let us pray that we are not contributing to the obstacles that might hinder another person's faith in Jesus you gather as a family, observe that there are things in our lives that nurture our faith and things that can hinder it. Talk about some of the things that nurture our faith—healthy family relationships, healthy friendships, good literature, and so on. Name some of the things that might be an obstacle to faith—unhealthy relationships, scandals, and so on. Observe that Jesus teaches us in today's Gospel that we are to do everything we can to help one another have faith in Jesus and do all that we can to avoid creating obstacles that might hinder another person's faith. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48. Conclude by praying together that we will be a family that helps each other grow in faith. Pray together today's psalm, Psalm 19, or the Lord's Prayer.
