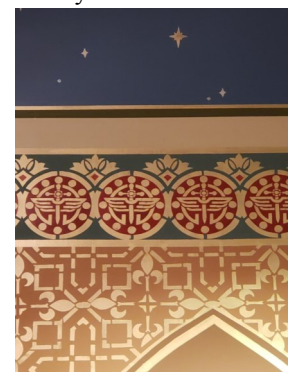
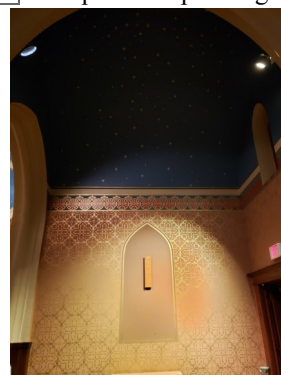

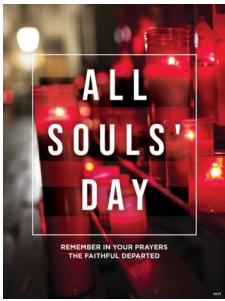

### Hay Fuerza Cuando Trabajamos Juntos

A veces pensamos que somos mejores que otros o mas cercanos a Dios y que merecemos más de Dios que otros. Santiago y Juan pidieron lugares especiales en el reino de la gloria de Jesús. ¡Wow! Ellos habían seguido a Jesús como los otros diez, pero se sintieron privilegiados, separándose de los otros diez. La idea de trabajar como un equipo no era algo de su pensamiento—tanto todavía tenían que aprender. ¿Qué pasó a la idea de unión, de unirse para que todos los apóstoles pudieran compartir la vida y las enseñanzas de Jesús?

A veces pensamos que podemos hacer muchísimo y en otros tiempos sabemos que debemos depender de Dios. No podemos hacer todo por nuestros propios esfuerzos. En unión con Dios logramos mucho más. No somos los todopoderosos.

Necesitaban trabajar unidos poniendo su talento y capacidad para el bien del equipo del baloncesto o voleibol o relevo de natación o pista, y estar orgulloso de lo que pudieran lograr juntos ayudando uno al otro.

En una producción teátrica no son solamente los actores que hacen la producción un éxito, pero hay tantas otras que cooperan en la producción. Algunas personas se encargan del maquillaje, otras del vestuario, otras de los decorados y otras de la iluminación... Faltando la cooperación de uno de estos afecta toda la producción. Hay que tener una cierta unidad entre todo el grupo que está trabajando en la producción.

Cuando trabajamos para mejorar una situación injusta, hay mucho más poder en un grupo de manifestantes que tener un solo manifestante. La unión entre varias personas pidiendo un cambio llama la atención. Así necesitamos actuar como una comunidad cristiana, no solamente hablando de injusticias sino haciendo algo unidos y juntos.

Los miembros de nuestra comunidad de fe tienen que trabajar juntos en todo: para celebrar las tradiciones culturales de fe, para dar culto juntos, para evangelizar, para dar de comer a los hambrientos y dar de beber a los sedientos, para compartir la fe con los niños por medio de grupos de formación en la fe y para hacer fiesta juntos. Juntos debemos caminar hacia adelante, no hablando mal del otro, sino intentando aprovechar el uso de los talentos de cada uno por el bien de todos. Así hay verdadero amor y respeto.

Como queremos que haya unión en la comunidad de fe, también necesitamos unidad en la familia para poder vivir la fe cristiana en un hogar de amor, de compartimiento, respeto y paz, donde otras pueden decir, "Miren como ellos se aman unos a otros."

## Family Connection

**Gospel Reading:** Mark 10:35-45

Jesus teaches that those who wish to be great must be the servant of all.

In the daily routine of family life, power struggles seem unavoidable. Whenever two or more people live together, there will be occasions of disagreement and attempts to exert influence over each other. Today's Gospel can be an invitation to consider how authority is exercised in your household. There is a temptation to exercise our authority in ways that show our power over others. Especially when conflicts emerge, many of us rely upon the power we believe our role gives to us. Jesus teaches us that there is a more persuasive form of leadership. In these daily challenges we have the opportunity to practice and teach the kind of service and leadership Jesus modeled for us in his ministry and in his passion and death.

As you gather as a family, invite family members to participate in a role play in which family roles are reversed. For example, you might assign children the role of parents putting their children to bed with parents acting like the children. Or you may have them role play parents asking for cooperation from children to clean up the family room. When the role play is finished, ask if it was an accurate picture of how this situation usually plays out in your household. Does everyone cooperate when asked? What happens when someone doesn't cooperate? How are the conflicts that emerge resolved? Observe that conflicts based on power struggles in situations such as these seem unavoidable in family life. In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches how Christians are to show their authority over others. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 10:35-45. After reading the Gospel, talk with your family about Jesus' unique message to his disciples about how they are to exercise authority. Talk about ways in which you might apply Jesus' words in your family life. Conclude by praying we may receive honor in God's eyes by learning to serve others in love. Pray together the Peace Prayer of Saint Francis.
