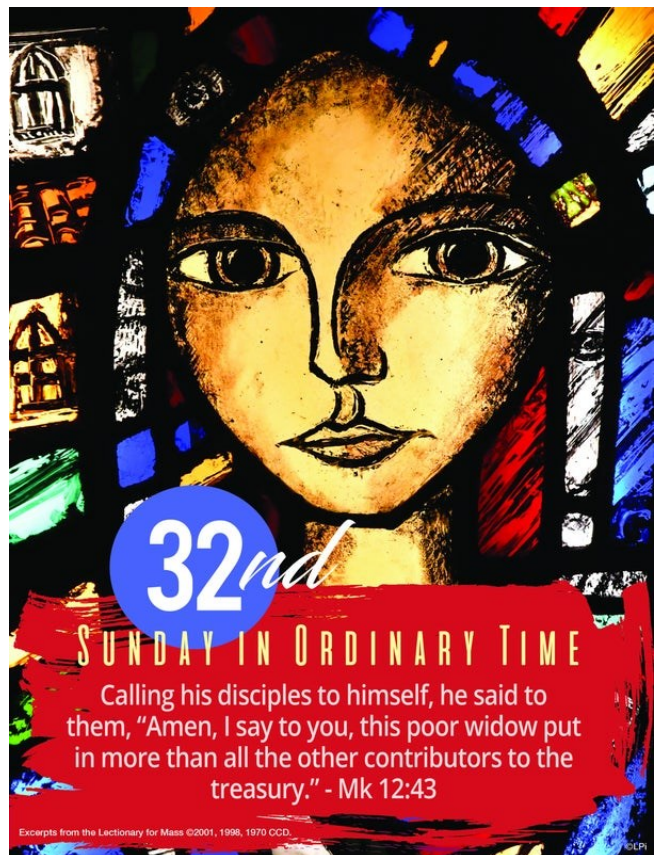

Hands of Christ: The Hands of Christ is a recognition program of the Diocese of Rochester which helps to assist parishes in affirming their high school seniors who have been the "Hands of Christ" in their church, home, school and community; it is sponsored by the Department of Evangelization and Catechesis. If you would like to nominate a 2021 graduating senior for this award, please see June Sherman for a nomination form or stop by the Parish Center to pick one up. Once all nominations are received by the deadline, the senior will then be contacted by mail with a letter explaining the award. Any youth nominated will be asked to write an essay about why they feel they should be considered for this recognition, being nominated does not mean they will receive the award. All nominations need to be received by November 25, 2021. Nominations will not be accepted after this date, as we have to contact the youth and give them time to write their essays. After all essays are received, the parish staff will decide on the recipients of the award. Please keep in mind the following criteria for someone to receive this award:
Has **consistently** demonstrated a Christian attitude by word and example.
Has been **actively involved** in the parish as well as their school or community.
Has been a **positive role model** to their peers, younger children and adults.
Is a **practicing Roman Catholic** in a parish in the Diocese of Rochester and **attends Mass.**
Is currently a **high school senior.**

DIOCESE OF ROCHESTER PERMANENT DIACONATE
The deacon is a man of faith, who is called from the community that already recognizes his dedication to service. He makes a lifetime commitment to serving the People of God by proclaiming the Word, assisting and presiding at liturgies, and ministering in the areas of charity and social justice. A deacon gives witness to his availability to the community by addressing present and emerging needs of the Church. The Diocese is inviting interested men of strong and active faith, who can demonstrate a record of service in the communities in which they live, work and worship, who may wish to explore a possible call to ordained ministry as a permanent deacon, to first speak with their pastor for an initial conversation. They may also contact Deacon Edward Giblin, Director of the Office of the Permanent Diaconate, at edward.giblin@dor.org, for additional information. A potential candidate must be at least 35 years of age and no older than 62 years of age at the time of ordination after a five (5) year period of formation. He must be in good health, emotionally mature, have stable relationships and must have the wholehearted support of his wife (if married) and family to enter the phase of inquiry. Because the parish is the primary experience of Church for most inquirers, the parish community is asked as well to invite from among its members men who exhibit strong faith and a spirit of service and encourage them to consider a possible vocation to the permanent diaconate.
