

Fr. Mike's Message...

Month of Remembrance

Some of you might recall that we as a Church celebrated the two great Liturgies of All Saints Day and All Souls Day about two weeks ago. These two celebrations take place beginning on Halloween night (All Hallows Eve) and go through November 1 and 2. November 1 is the day on which we celebrate the Hallowed ones; all the Saints of the Church, both those that we know and those we don't know. We give thanks for the Saints, both for the example they gave to us on earth, and that they continue to guide us and intercede for us in Heaven.

November 2 is a slightly different celebration; in that it is not so much a celebration as it is a commemoration. We remember not the saints in Heaven, but rather those who have died but have not yet entered into Heaven. Unlike the known saints, the majority of people do not enter directly into Heaven upon their death. Instead, those who are saved enter into Purgatory, a place where a person's soul is purified and perfected, made ready for it to be able to enter into Heaven. This day, then, is a chance for us to both remember those who have died, particularly our own loved ones, as well as remember our responsibility to pray for those who are still in Purgatory. Our prayers for them help to purify their souls, thus our prayers directly help our loved ones enter into the Heavenly Kingdom.

It is not a coincidence, then, that these two days stand at the beginning of the month of November. It is a reminder to us that while there is a special celebration for the dead at the beginning of the month, the entire month of November is a month set aside by the Church to remember the dead. For those of you especially who have lost loved ones recently, this can be an opportunity for you to spend time in prayer and reflection, maybe with other family members. Something as simple as saying a prayer to God on their behalf, or maybe lighting a candle and spending some time praying and reminiscing about a loved one with family, are different ways that we can mark this month set aside for the deceased.

I encourage all of you to take the opportunity to pray for loved ones you have lost, but also to pray for those in Purgatory who still need prayers but have no one to pray for them. Remember that life is short, and one day we will most likely be in need of those on Earth to pray for us, so let us set that example and faithfully live out the last great Spiritual Work of Mercy—to Pray for the Dead.



Responsabilidad de Construir la Fe en Su Familia

En 1994 los obispos de EE. UU. publicaron una carta pastoral, Sigan el Camino del Amor, sobre la familia que es nuestra primera comunidad y la más básica. Una parte de las obras de la familia es prometida el día del bautismo de su hijo: transmitir la fe, enseñar a los hijos lo que nosotros los católicos creemos, y a la vez fortalecernos para la misión en el mundo, fuera de la familia. ¿Padres, cumplen lo que prometieron cuando sus hijos fueron bautizados? No siempre. Sabemos que los que han tenido una experiencia de fe en la familia crecen para ser adultos que tienen una relación fuerte con Jesucristo y están comprometidos a su fe como adultos. Los que meten su fe en la vida familiar diariamente están ayudando a sus hijos hacer lo mismo cuando ellos son adultos. Las familias que nutren fe están tomando en serio su responsabilidad de formar discípulos.

Quizás los padres y madres están pensando, ¿Cómo podemos hacer eso? En el hogar hay que hablar de Dios y cómo estar presente y hablar con Dios por oración. También hablen sobre lo que creen y por qué los católicos lo creen. Compartan cómo su fe es una ayuda en hacer decisiones y la importancia de poner su fe en acción. Que triste es cuando un joven sabe muy poco de Dios y de su fe porque no ha sido una parte importante en la vida

Algunas maneras posibles de ayudar a sí mismo y a sus hijos es que cuando:

*Tú crees en Dios y que Dios te quiere. Es Dios a quien tú pides ayuda en tiempos difíciles; es a Dios a quien tú agradeces cuando las cosas te van bien.

*Tú amas y sigues creyendo en el valor de otra persona. Los niños entienden cómo es el amor de Dios por el amor que han experimentado de otras personas.

*Tú evangelizas por actuar de acuerdo con los valores del evangelio y así dando un ejemplo de la vida cristiana a sus hijos. Los hijos pueden captar el significado de eso.

*Tú educas por hablar a sus hijos de la fe y los valores de la vida cristiana. Tu ejemplo de vida enseña.

*Como familia oran juntos, dando gracias a Dios por sus bendiciones, pidiendo fuerza y consejo.

*En familia ustedes sirven uno a otro, a veces sacrificando sus propias deseos por el bien de otros. *Tú luchas para aceptar tus cruces y llevarlas con amor.

*Tú perdonas y buscas reconciliación. Aun los padres y madres deben hacer eso con sus hijos. Deja ir las viejas heridas y rencores para hacer la paz unos con otros.

*Tú celebras la vida—cumpleaños, bodas, nacimientos, muertes, trabajos nuevos, reuniones familiares, graduación, días feriados...Cuando están juntos comparten historias, y así siendo más una familia de amor.

*Tú actúas justamente cuando tratas a otras con respeto, y cuando estás en contra de racismo y discriminación y haces cosas para combatir hambre, pobreza... Hermana Kay

Has been actively involved in the parish as well as their school or community.

Has been a **positive role model** to their peers, younger children and adults.
