

#### Descubriendo a Dios como Madre

Yo amé a mis padres. Siempre me sentía su amor, preocupación por mí, su interés en lo que yo hacía, en mis estudios, y en las actividades de los grupos a los cuales pertenecía. Cuando yo era maestra en Elmira, de vez en cuando visité a mis padres por un fin de semana. Yo y mi madre conversaba después de la medianoche, y tanto me gustaron esas conversaciones. Sentí ese amor de mi madre, la alegría de estar con ella, y como si sus brazos amorosos estuvieran envueltos alrededor de mí. Ah, el amor de una madre para con su hija.

Dios nos entiende, nos ama y nos trata así. Los brazos envolviéndonos así, invitándonos a postrar nuestras cabezas cansadas para consolarnos así mostrando su amor—totalmente aceptándonos. Este aspecto de Dios nos muestra a Dios como una madre mas que un padre. Por tanto tiempo los hombres que son los teólogos, escritores espirituales y liturgistas han hablado de Dios en términos de un hombre, pero frecuentemente podemos encontrar a Dios mas como una madre que un padre.

Dios nos crea y nos ama como una madre ama a su hijo(a). Isaías me viene a la mente cuando él escribió "Sión decía: "Yavé me ha abandonado y el Señor se ha olvidado de mí." Pero. ¿puede una mujer olvidarse del niño que cría, o dejar de querer al hijo de sus entrañas? Pues bien, aunque alguna lo olvidarse, yo nunca olvidaría de ti." (Is. 49, 14-15). Así yo pienso en Dios como una madre.

También podemos pensar en Salmo 131, 2 "...tranquila y en silencio he mantenido mi alma, como un niño saciado que se aprieta a su madre; mi alma en mí nada reclama." ¡Yo siento mi Dios tan frecuentemente como una madre!

Orando por una persona enferma puede ser una oración a Dios madre: "Envuelve tus brazos alrededor de mi amiga enferma; protégela con tu amor y presencia sanadora." No hay muchas referencias a Dios como madre, pero ¿recuerdan a Jesús hablando a Jerusalén? "Cuántas veces he querido reunir a tus hijos, como la gallina reúne a sus pollitos bajo sus alas." (Mt. 23, 37). La gallina mantiene a sus pollitos cómodos y protegidos.

Puede ser que usted va a decirme que Dios no es masculino ni femenino, y es cierto, pero para mí es importante reconocer las

cualidades de Dios que son parecidas a las de una madre y no siempre referir a Dios con el pronombre masculino.

La voz de Jesú es única! gunta a Jesús qué cosa

Dios tiene para nosotros ese tipo de amor de una

madre que nunca va a fallarnos. Ah, Dios, gracias por todo tu amor tierno que nos das.

Has been a positive role model to their peers, younger children and adults.


Is a practicing Roman Catholic in a parish in the Diocese of Rochester and attends Mass.
