### Esperando en Adviento

El Año Litúrgico se terminó la semana pasada con la fiesta de Cristo Rey y ahora tan pronto estamos empezando un nuevo año litúrgico 2022, año C (usando el evangelio de San Lucas) de los tres ciclos de lecturas que la Iglesia usa los domingos. Adviento es un tiempo de esperar y de esperanza. Este tiempo de Adviento fue el último tiempo agregado al año litúrgico de la Iglesia. Se empezó en España y Francia en el siglo IV con una práctica de ayuno y oración de 40 días, pero cuando la Iglesia romana adoptó el Adviento en el siglo VI, Adviento fue reducido a cuatro domingos y a la vez el aspecto de sacrificio fue eliminado.

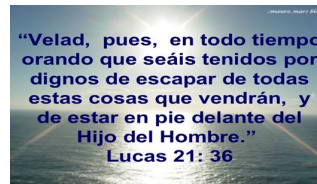


El Adviento no es solamente un recuerdo del pasado (Jesucristo vino al mundo como un bebé recién nacido), sino es una esperanza del futuro (Cristo volverá en el futuro en los tiempos finales). También podemos incluir la esperanza que tenemos de la llegada de Cristo en nuestras vidas diariamente, aunque eso no es solamente en el tiempo de Adviento, sino todo el año.

Las lecturas de las primeras dos semanas de Adviento ponen énfasis en la segunda venida de Cristo, y el tercer domingo a Juan Bautista y el cuarto a María. Demasiadas veces pensamos que solamente estamos esperando celebrar de nuevo el hecho histórico del nacimiento del niño Jesús en Belén y ponemos todo el énfasis en la encarnación, olvidando la esperanza de la segunda venida de Jesucristo. Pero Jesús creció y enseñaba, actuaba con compasión y amor a los pobres y necesitados, predicando sobre el Reino de Dios. Es ese Reino de Dios que Cristo nos pide establecer en nuestros mundos. Es ese Reino en su plenitud que Él nos promete al final de los tiempos.

Piensen en la oración que Cristo dio a sus discípulos. ¿Qué mención hay del reino de Dios? “Venga a nosotros tu reino.” Es por hacer la voluntad de Dios y el camino de Jesús que el reino puede existir ahora y en su plenitud va a venir. El no pide que hagamos un reino nuestro, sino el reino de Él usando en esa construcción los consejos de Él de cómo vivir. Al final viviremos en la plenitud del Reino de Dios.

Durante este tiempo de Adviento esperamos con mucha anticipación. Cuando celebramos la fiesta de Navidad recordamos y damos gracias por la encarnación de Dios—la llegada de Jesucristo a nuestro mundo. La esperanza de los siglos fue realizada en Jesús quien fue reconocido eventualmente como el Mesías, el prometido y el esperado. ¡Feliz otro año litúrgico! Piensen en qué pueden hacer para preparar su regalo de vida para Cristo el 25 de diciembre. *Hermana Kay*
