

Fr. Mike's Message...

Come, Lord Jesus You might recall that in my article last month, I talked about how the month of November has been designated by the Church as a month to remember and pray for the deceased, as the celebrations of All Saints Day and All Souls Day begin the month. In December, of course, the focus shifts. While the secular world is busy celebrating Christmas all month, we as a Church try to take a more solemn approach to life in the weeks leading up to Christmas day.



Advent is not meant to be a time of celebration, of feasting, of merriment. It is a season of longing, a season of quiet, a season of contemplation. It is also a season of preparation. Last week, we heard about St. John the Baptist going into the desert, giving a baptism of repentance, helping people to prepare their hearts for the imminent coming of the Lord.

There are a number of ways in which we can prepare ourselves during the Advent season. One of the most important ways that we can prepare our hearts for Christ is to build our prayer life. Prayer is, of course, one of the most important things we do as Christians every day of the year, not just during Advent. However, like Lent, the Church has set this time aside as an opportunity to really focus on developing our prayer lives, particularly for those who haven't had much of one before. Amidst the hustle and bustle of the holiday season, it is imperative that we find some time for quiet and converse with the Lord. It is only when we develop our relationship with God that we will be able to correct the issues that we need to fix in our lives, as well as fully understand where and how God is calling us.

Along with prayer, another way to prepare our hearts for the coming of the Lord is through the Sacrament of Confession. All of us are sinners, all of us need God's forgiveness, and it is only through the grace of the sacrament of confession that we can fully mend the break in the relationship with God that sin causes. While Advent is not as fully a penitential season like the season of Lent, penitence is one important part of it, and a crucial part of preparing our hearts for God's coming.

Finally, another way to prepare ourselves is through charity. As Christians, we need to go out and serve others on a regular basis. What works out nicely is that during December, there are always many different opportunities to serve. Whether it be in the Church, at a soup kitchen, homeless shelter, etc. This is a golden opportunity to put our faith into action. If you don't have as much time to serve, you can still be charitable through donations, as there is always a great need of many things this time of year.

December is always a busy time of year: presents to buy, food to prepare, gifts to wrap, decorations to put up, etc. It can be very hectic, and very stressful. I hope that, in the midst of the busyness, we will all get some opportunities to find some quiet time to be with God, and live out our discipleship, always preparing our hearts for the Lord's coming.

Floor of the Nave is stained and sealed. The pews will be replaced this week. Prep work in the elevator shaft is completed and the elevator is due about December 15th. Carpeting has come in and will be installed after the floors are finished and pews are back in place. Once the altar area is cleared of the pews, the reredos modifications can be completed and the Tabernacle placed in the center of the Sanctuary. I have had conversations with Parson's Organ Company. They are scheduled to be in the church to reassemble our organ on December 22nd and 23rd. I know that sounds like it's "last minute", but keep in mind that the internal workings of organs and dust are not friends. So, the area needs to be dust free as possible before the pipes are reassembled. Think of the renovation project as a giant 3-D puzzle. We are at the point where the last few pieces are being put into place. Please continue your prayers as we approach the finish line!

Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe

Hoy celebramos la gran y especial fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe especialmente en las Américas. Se encuentra su imagen en su Basílica, la casita que ella pidió "para mostrar y dar todo mi amor, compasión, auxilio y defensa, pues yo soy su piadosa Madre."

Estamos celebrando en el medio de Adviento y unas dos semanas antes de la Navidad de Jesucristo. Ante todo, hoy celebramos a Cristo Salvador quien es la fuente de la vida nueva. La unión única de Cristo y María celebramos hoy. María coopera con fidelidad a Dios y ella es un modelo de cómo seguir a Cristo.



También celebramos la maternidad de María; la imagen de María que se dejó en la tilma de Juan Diego nos muestra una mujer en cinta y un embarazo avanzado—a unos días de dar a luz. El manto color azul verde indica que es una emperatriz. La túnica es el color de la tierra y contiene nueve flores por los nueve pueblos indígenas que poblaron el valle en el tiempo de la aparición. Las nubes son asociadas con lo divino—María es enviado por Dios. El manto es cubierto de las estrellas que brillaban en esa fecha sobre esa parte de México. Los rayos del sol con María delante indican que hay una nueva era. Las mujeres casadas se peinaban con trenzas, por eso el cabello suelto es evidencia de su virginidad. El color de su piel muestra una mezcla de raza blanca e indígena. Su cabeza inclinada muestra una actitud bondadosa y humilde. Sus manos están unidas en oración, pidiendo por sus hijos, los indígenas. La luna negra es conectada al nombre náhuatl de México (en el ombligo de la luna). El ángel es indio, niño y anciano a la vez, fuerte y sabio. Es mensajero de la Virgen y representa a Juan Diego quien trae la noticia de vida y verdad.

Hay mucho simbolismo contenido en la imagen. María aparece a un humilde indígena, dando importancia a los indígenas y su cultura. Celebramos las palabras de María y la respuesta y obediencia de Juan Diego, quien nos representa. Este día es un encuentro entre nuestra realidad humana y la realidad divina. Que descubramos todo el amor del Hijo y que participemos de su vida divina. Que la Iglesia siempre sea reflejo de la Virgen María y que recordemos los indígenas, los primeros destinarios de la Buena Nueva de María de Guadalupe.


