



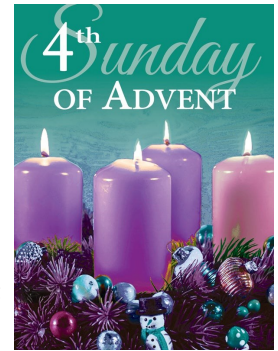

## La Ultima Semana de Espera

La semana antes de la Navidad de Cristo la Iglesia tiene oraciones especiales, las O Antifonas, que se rezan en la oración de las vísperas. 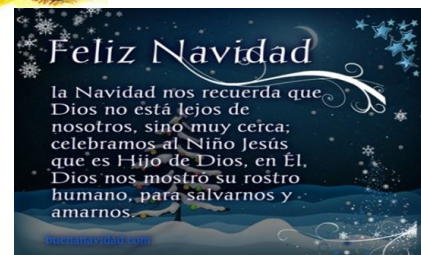

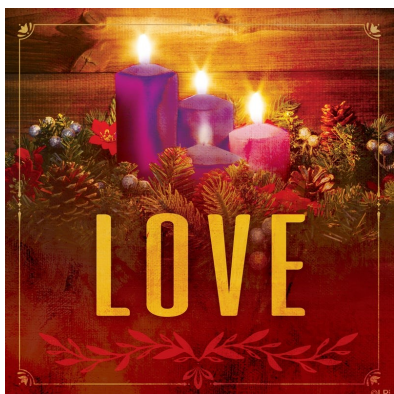
