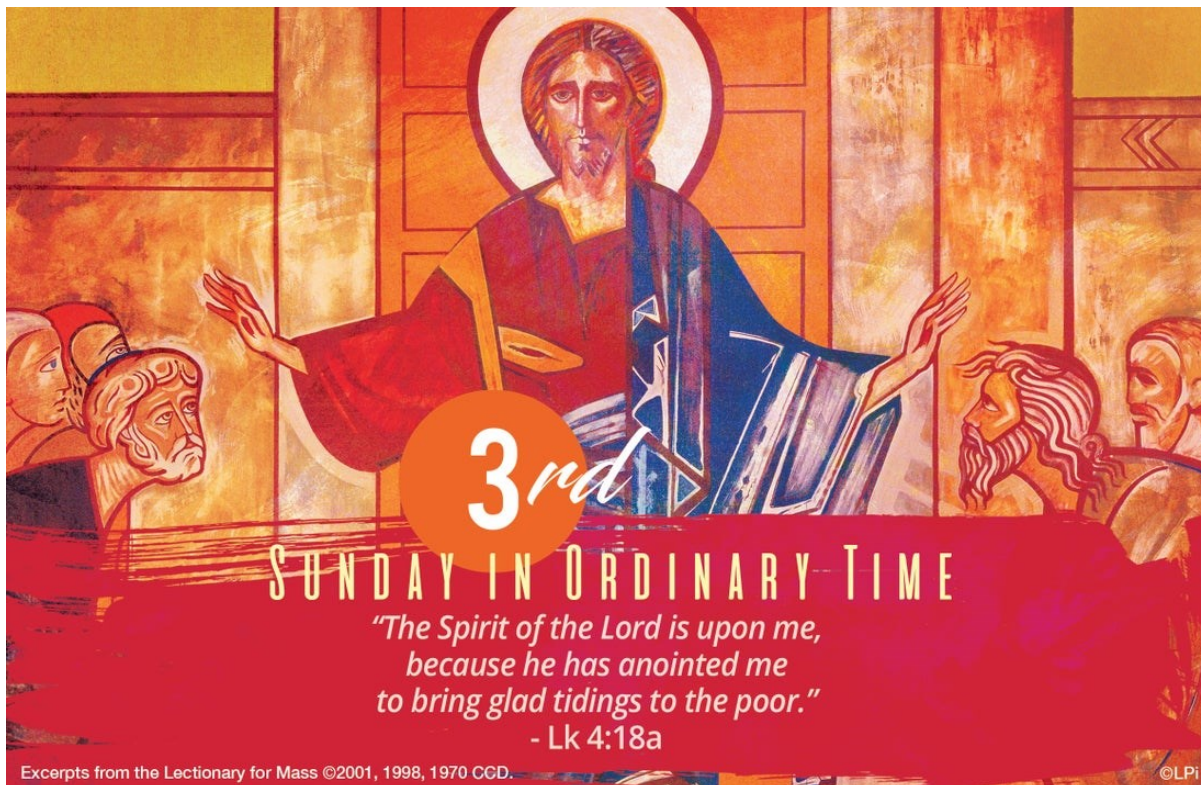

How good is the hearing of our heart? Do we allow people to express themselves, to walk in faith

even though they have had difficulties in life, and to be part of the life of the community without being hindered rejected or judged?

¿Cómo Vivimos la Misión de Jesucristo?

Lucas empieza su evangelio escribiendo que él quiere ordenar las cosas que habían ocurrido entre los discípulos de Jesús y Jesús para mostrar que las verdades que los apóstoles enseñaron vinieron de lo que ellos y los pueblos vivían con Jesucristo. Hay que conocer los acontecimientos y saber las actitudes y acciones de Jesús al estar con individuos y grupos de personas. Al saber cómo él actuaba en distintas situaciones es posible empezar a conocerlo. En el evangelio de hoy escuchamos cómo el adulto Jesús inicia su misión. Está en la sinagoga en su pueblo de Nazaret, y después de leer un trozo del profeta Isaías, él dice que él está ungido para llevar las buenas noticias a los pobres, cautivos, ciegos y a los oprimidos. Él proclama su intención de hacer esto al empezar su misión y en el futuro al vivir su misión. No vino para los educados y ricos, sino para los pobres y oprimidos de la sociedad.

¿Cómo fue su preparación? Por su vida en Nazaret, aprendiendo ser carpintero y asistiendo en la oración y educación sobre las Escrituras en la sinagoga Jesús tuvo su preparación. Encima de eso hay que pensar en la oración personal de Jesús. Podemos mirar a nosotros mismos. ¿Cómo ha sido la preparación nuestra para poder continuar la misión de Jesús en nuestro mundo con la gente de hoy? ¿Hemos escuchado las numerosas prédicas dadas por los sacerdotes y diáconos y hemos reflexionado sobre ellas? Siempre es importante aplicar los mensajes de las lecturas sobre nuestras propias vidas. Todavía entre nosotros están los pobres, los oprimidos, los ciegos y encarcelados. ¿Llevamos a los pobres la buena nueva, a los oprimidos y cautivos la libertad y a los ciegos la posibilidad de ver y entender la verdad?

Por el sacramento de Bautismo estamos bautizados a seguir a Jesucristo y vivir en nuestras vidas y en nuestro tiempo la misión de Jesús. ¿A quiénes hoy en día podemos liberar de lo que les quita la libertad? ¿Quiénes son ciegos a la manera que tratan a otras personas? ... o ciegos a la bondad del otro? ¿Qué es lo que le hace a una persona estar encarcelado en su propia mente por las mentiras que cree o las falsas oportunidades de estar reconocido como una persona importante? ¿Cómo podemos ayudar al otro ver la verdad de su situación? Es por medio de nuestro conocimiento más profundo de Dios que llegamos al instrumento de la libertad y la verdad: Dios. Sigamos a Cristo y encontraremos el poder de liberar y ayudar a otros ver la verdad. *Hermana Kay*

Family Connection

Gospel Reading: Luke 1:1-4;4:14-21
In the synagogue at Nazareth, Jesus reads aloud from the scroll of the prophet Isaiah and announces that this Scripture is now fulfilled.

Jesus was the one sent by God to bring salvation to the world. Jesus announced that mission using the framework we hear in today's Gospel from the prophet Isaiah: glad tidings will be brought to the poor, liberty to captives, recovery of sight for the blind, and freedom for the oppressed. Jesus inaugurates the Kingdom of God in his person—through his life, death, and Resurrection. We are charged with the task of continuing the mission that Jesus began. Jesus set the framework for all of us when he announced his ministry in today's Gospel. Jesus also gave us the helper we would need to enable us to participate in his mission. The Holy Spirit has been given to us so that we, the Church, might serve the Kingdom of God.

Gather with your family and suggest that they try to picture the vision that Jesus describes using the words of the prophet Isaiah as you read today's Gospel, Luke 1:1-4; 4:14-21. Think about your neighborhood, your community. What are the situations and who are the people who most need to see this vision fulfilled? What steps would be necessary to make the vision a reality for them? Make a family commitment to pray for the Kingdom of God and to take a particular action that will address a need you see in your community. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you by praying the Prayer to the Holy Spirit.

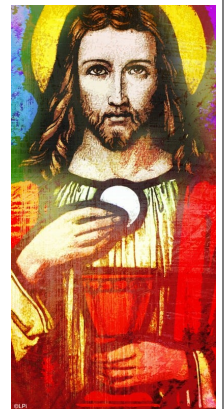
