I would like to draw your attention to the *Catholic Ministries Appeal* which began in October 2021. Bishop Matano wrote a letter to everyone in the Diocese inviting us to support this important Diocesan Appeal. **Our combined goal for St. Michael is \$40,814** but we only have 161 donors making up 71% toward our goal. 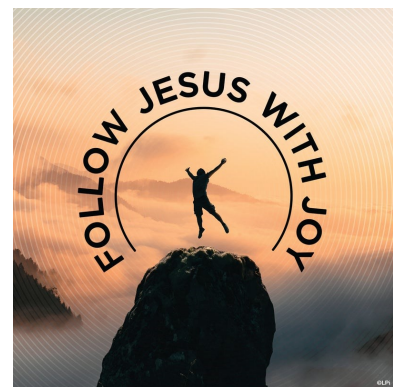

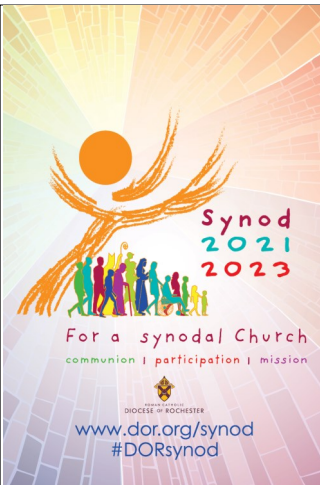

Jesus said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. (Lk 5:4-6) Pope Francis tells us that, "Synodality is more than just a word or a slogan. Synodality is an expression of the very nature of the Church—the process of discerning how the Spirit is moving us, so

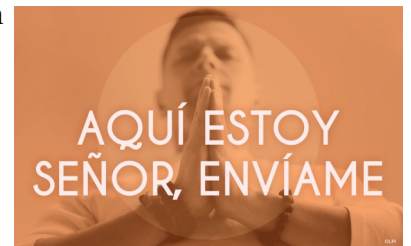


6 de febrero de 2022

5º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Dios no quiere actuar solo, Dios pide colaboración de otros para llevar a cabo su misión de anunciar su Reino. Jesús quiere colaboradores efectivos y activos. Hoy, llama exclusivamente a Pedro, por medio de la pesca milagrosa. Jesús inicia un diálogo con Pedro al terminar su predicación a la multitud, que se aglomeraba a su alrededor. Dando a Pedro una orden: *"Lleva la barca mar adentro y echen las redes para pescar"* (Lucas 5,4). La orden de Jesús parece fuera de sí. Ellos habían trabajado toda la noche y no había pasado nada, solo el cansancio y la frustración de una tarea no completada. Además, ellos eran expertos en eso de la pesca y durante el día usualmente se pesca poco o nada.

Esta pesca milagrosa es el llamado a los apóstoles para llevar a cabo la pesca de hombres. ¿Será capaz Pedro de conducir a hombres y mujeres al Señor? Recordemos que el Papa Francisco continua esa labor de llevarnos a todos sin excepción de raza y culturas al Señor. Tres hombres de esa época, Santiago, Juan y Pedro, nos dice el Evangelio que *"Enseguida llevaron sus barcas a tierra, lo dejaron todo y siguieron a Jesús"* (Lucas 5,11). Ellos sellaron su compromiso de amor y seguimiento. ¿Cuál es tu compromiso como bautizado de pescar a tu familia y seguir al Señor? Los tiempos que vivimos son difíciles, saliendo de una de pandemia, quizá aun en búsqueda de trabajo, de casa y sustento para los tuyos. Sin embargo, debemos seguir invocando al Señor que nos escucha siempre. Respondiendo en medio de cada circunstancia: *"Aquí estoy, Señor, envíame"* (Isaías 6,8).

Family Connection

Gospel Reading: Luke 5:1-11

The fishermen (Simon, James, and John) leave their fishing boats and follow Jesus.

In the people whom Jesus chose to be his closest friends—his disciples—we see many of the characteristic foibles of ordinary human beings. We also see the ways that God uses the gifts he gave us to transform us into new people, the agents through whom God will lead others to Jesus and to his kingdom. Let's consider the person Jesus chose to be a leader among the disciples and whom he sent to "catch people." Based on the evidence found in Scripture, we can imagine what Peter must have been like:

- Peter seems unafraid to speak his mind, yet he is also able to take direction. In today's Gospel, Simon Peter lowers his nets as Jesus commands, but not before reminding Jesus that he and his partners have been fishing all night and haven't caught anything.
- Peter is a leader, a spokesperson for others. Today's Gospel suggests that Simon Peter was a leader in his fishing business. When Simon Peter chooses to follow Jesus, others become Jesus' disciple as well.
- Peter's personality and charisma seem to make him the center of attention; yet Peter learned to be transparent, to let others see Jesus through him.
- Peter possesses a dynamic and open relationship with Jesus. Peter often approaches Jesus and speaks what is in his heart.

Gather as a family and spend some time imagining the person of Simon Peter. Encourage family members to tell details about Simon Peter that they recall from Scripture. Consider these questions: Is Peter someone you would like to be friends with? Why or why not? Do you consider Peter a good leader? Why or why not? Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 5:1-11. Jesus chose Simon Peter to be the leader of the disciples. Peter continued to be a leader in the early Christian community; we continue to speak of Peter's leadership when we call the pope the successor of Peter. Discuss the role of the papacy and of other leaders in the Church. In what ways do we participate in the mission of the Church by leading people to Christ ("catching people")? Pray for those who lead the Church. Pray together the Prayer to St. Joseph, the Protector of the Church.

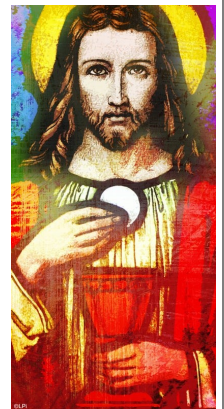
