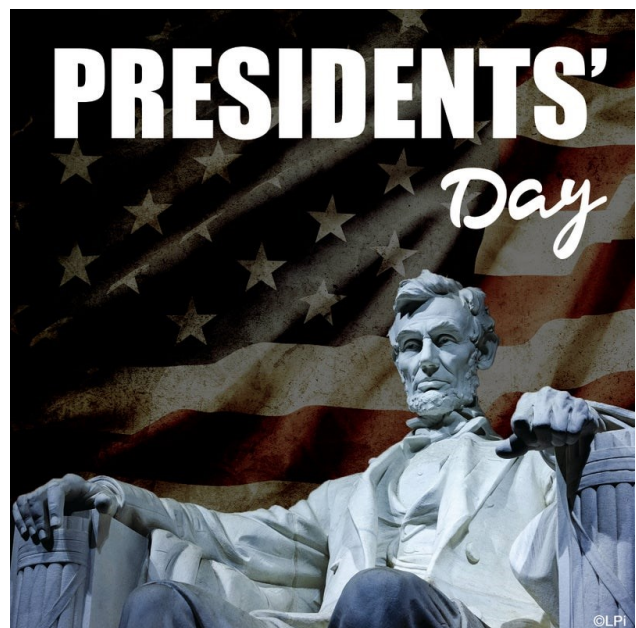
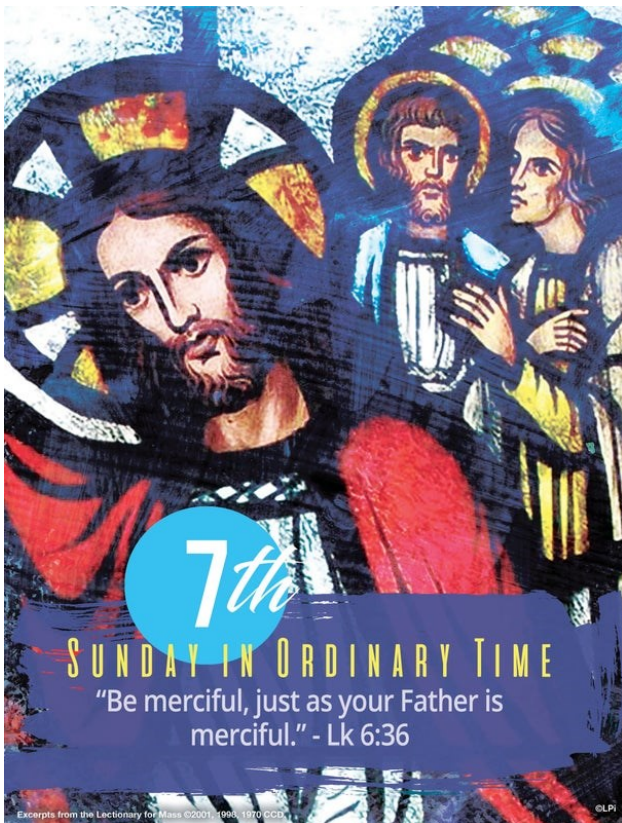

Porque he usado un andador para caminar no he podido hacer varias cosas y he dependido de la ayuda de otras. Una de las hermanas especialmente me ha ayudado mucho, y le pregunté por qué ella ha estado tan buena conmigo. ¿No es el amor? Así es.

Que Dios bendiga a cada uno de ustedes y ayude a ustedes vivir una vida de amor.

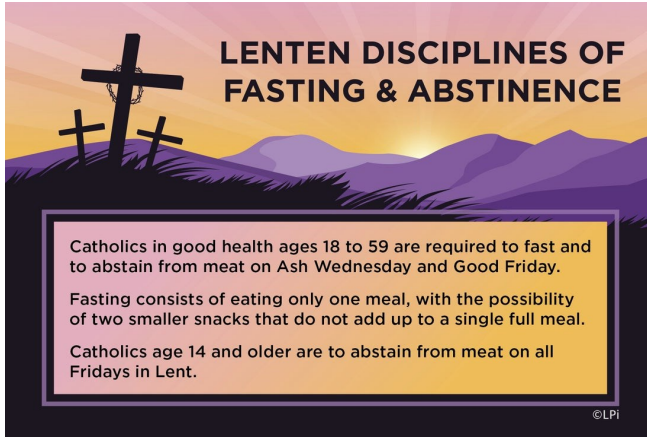
