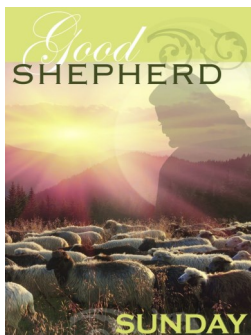

Fr. Mike's Message...

Mother's Day

Today, we celebrate mothers everywhere. The one's who gave birth to us, the ones who raised us, the ones who have been there to celebrate our achievements, and have been there to absorb the tears of our failures. My hope is that everyone gets a chance today to give your mother a hug, or at least a phone call, to remind her of just how special and important she is to you.

I always found it very fitting that Mother's Day falls in the month of May. After all, May is the month dedicated to Mary, and Mary, though a virgin, is both the Mother of God as well as the mother of us all. When Jesus was on the cross, he spoke to both his mother and the beloved disciple John: "Woman, behold your son", and "behold, your mother". In this simple exchange, Jesus was giving his mother not just to John, but in reality, to the entire Church. Mary continues to be our guiding light. She continues to be an advocate, as she will always be there for us.

Our earthly caregivers (mothers, grandmothers, step-mothers, adopted mothers, etc.) are there to take care of our physical and emotional needs. Mothers sacrifice so much for their children, more than sometimes even they realize. To this day, whenever something happens to me, usually my first call is to my mother. I think this is the case for most of us. Other than spouses, our parents are still the ones we talk to first, for advice, to celebrate or mourn, or simply just to chat. And this is the case no matter what the age. It doesn't matter if we are 5 or 55, our mother is always our mother, and for a mother, their child is always their child.

Just as our earthly mothers take care of our physical and emotional needs, Mary will always be there to help with our spiritual needs. Mary was, and is, the perfect example of discipleship, the one who always followed her son, the one who said "Yes" to God. Mary lived a life of purity, of fidelity, and of service. All of us strive to live that same type of life, and Mary can help us along the way.

And so, my brothers and sisters, let us take this opportunity today (and everyday) to thank our mothers for all they have done for us. As we do so, may we also never forget our spiritual mother, who sits with her Son in the Heavenly kingdom, always willing to help us and guide us along this earthy journey.

Música en Nuestras Celebraciones

Tenemos muchos medios de comunicarnos con Dios. La oración no es solamente estar en silencio y hablarle a Dios. Es caminar por la calle y contactar a Dios por medio de otras. Es también caminar en la naturaleza y sentir ese Dios Creador, ese Dios bello, ese Dios siempre vivo. Oración puede ser sentir y estar llevado a Dios y conocer el amor de Dios por medio de un abrazo o beso de alguien amado. Oración puede estar sentado en silencio ante el Santísimo. Oración también es cuando celebramos los sacramentos con otras en comunidad. Oración puede ser cuando oramos el rosario solo o con otras personas. Hay tantas maneras de estar en comunicación con Dios.

Como parte de la celebración Eucarística es la música. Tenemos la música instrumental y vocal como manera de estar en comunicación con Dios. La música puede ser muy emocional, sea alegría, tristeza, amor, perdón... El cantar como asamblea nos une en expresar nuestra creencia en común. Si te abras al significado de lo que tú estás cantando, las emociones fluyen sobre ti. Dios está presente en la letra, las notas musicales y en los sonidos de las voces y los instrumentos. Sabemos que los salmos fueron escritos para cantar; son un modo del habla humana.

Aldous Huxley escribió que "Después del silencio, lo que mas se acerca a expresar lo inexpressable es la música." La música nos ayuda a ir mas despacio en la vida, de tomar tiempo para pensar, reflexionar, expresarnos de una manera mas poética. Si la persona se llena de la música, parece que la vida sigue con menos esfuerzo. Es posible que la música puede nombrar Dios y comunicar Dios a nosotros.

Durante la Misa usamos una variedad de música instrumental y cantada. Como comunidad es esencial que cantemos, que metamos nuestras voces con las voces de los demás. ¿Y por qué muchos no cantan? Algunas personas van a decir que su voz no es buena. Dios acepta todas las voces. No todos somos fantásticos al cantar, pero somos fantásticos porque queremos dar alabanza, gloria a Dios y sentir la alegría y confort de Dios que recibimos por cantar.

Otras dicen que no cantan porque no han aprendido las canciones. No siempre vamos a cantar las mismas canciones. ¿Tu siempre dice la misma cosa a tus hermanos o padres o hijos? Cuando tenemos cantos nuevos Nancy Rowe practica con la asamblea ante de empezar la Misa. En este tiempo de Pascua vamos a aprender un nuevo Santo y espero que hagan el esfuerzo para aprenderlo. Estamos reunidos los domingos en comunidad y no es bueno decidir que vas a hacer tu oración personal solo y no cantar. Preferencias personales son múltiples y puede ser que no siempre te gusta las canciones que se usan. Favor de darme a mí o dar a Nancy Rowe alguna canción que te gusta o una sugerencia sobre la música.

Que bueno sería si todos en la iglesia los domingos se consideren parte de la comunidad y así cantan a Dios para expresar su amor, su arrepentimiento, su alegría, su alabanza... Es también importante responder al sacerdote cuando nos saluda, nos pide profesar nuestra creencia igual o termina una oración. Nuestra participación en la Eucaristía debe ser activa. ¿Están conmigo para mejorar nuestras celebraciones comunitarias? Espero que sí. Dios espera más que un cuerpo inactivo en el banco. ¡Aleluya, Cristo ha resucitado! *Hermana Kay*

Family Connection

Not only can we recognize family members' voices, we can also read the tone of their voices and know something about how they are feeling. In our relationship with Jesus, we know Jesus' voice and are called to follow. Jesus doesn't just bring us closer to the Father, Jesus puts us directly into contact with God the Father, removing all distance between us. In the Gospel of John, Jesus identifies so closely with the Father that he tells us that they are one—not just close, but actually one. Knowing Jesus means knowing the Father. Read with your family today's Gospel, John 10:27-30. Ask your family members to talk about some ways that Jesus brings them closer to God and closer to one another. Pray together the Acts of Faith, Hope, and Love.

*O my God, I firmly believe that you are one God in three divine Persons, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. I believe that your divine Son became man and died for our sins, and that he will come to judge the living and the dead.
