### RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

Today's Gospel speaks of being prepared, of not knowing at what hour Christ may return. It speaks of being vigilant upon his arrival and not being caught asleep. This is a great opportunity to reflect upon our lives and to evaluate if we are prepared and living a vigilant life.

Today's Gospel makes it clear that we must not excuse ourselves by saying we don't know what God's will is. We heard in the Gospel, "*That servant who knew his master's will, but did not make preparations nor act in accord with his will shall be beaten severely; and the servant who was ignorant of his master's will but acted in a way deserving of a severe beating shall be beaten only lightly*" (Luke 12:48). The Scriptures are showing that we must know what God's will is and then do his will.

We also heard in today's Gospel, that we should "*be like servants who await their master's return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks*" (Luke 12:36). This means that we have to be vigilant, be alert, listening and ready to do whatever God asks of us when he speaks to our hearts.

If we remain vigilant; if we are ready and willing to obey divine inspiration and follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit immediately and without delay or excuses, then we are firmly on the way of salvation.

When you examine your conscience every evening, and especially before confession, please ask yourself if you have acted on the inspiration of the Spirit, and whether you responded promptly and willingly.

And even if the Holy Spirit prompts you to "*sell your belongings and give alms,*" don't worry – he probably won't ask you to donate \$10,000 for one Mass.

Today is Sunday - the Lord's Day, that is, the day of the Lord's love for us, revealed to us in the Eucharist and in many other ways. Let's use this day well!

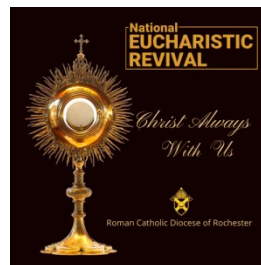

### Family Connection

Years ago, most families had only one or two clocks in their home. Today, we have clocks everywhere—on our walls, on our microwave ovens, on our DVD players, on our cell phones, and so on. As a family, go through the house and count how many clocks (time-telling devices) your family has. Talk about important events for which family members need to be on time. Recall experiences of being late for something, either as individuals or as a family. Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus talks about how important it is for us to be aware and alert, otherwise, we will miss something.

Read aloud Luke 12:32-48. Talk about the parable that Jesus told and discuss how the master will feel if he arrives to find his servant doing his job. Discuss what our job is as disciples of Jesus. Explain that, just as we need to be aware of the time so that we don't miss anything important, we also need to be alert and focused on our jobs, our responsibilities as followers of Jesus.

Encourage each family member to place a sacred symbol near the clock that they use most in the house and to use the symbol and the clock as a reminder that it is always "time" for us to be acting like disciples of Christ.

## La Escucha—Tan Importante

A veces puede ser difícil para una persona prestar atención a otra persona y tomar tiempo para realmente escuchar al otro. Puede ser que la otra persona tiene valores que no le gusten o alguien que apoya un partido político opuesto al partido suyo o una persona que no es un amigo o alguien con quien no tiene buenas relaciones o alguien que se pega a uno como un parásito o alguien que tiene un problema y uno no sabe cómo reaccionar o ayudar o una persona que siempre es negativa o alguien que siempre llora... Es difícil prestar atención a estos tipos de personas y puede ser que muchas cosas distintas a lo que está contando el otro pasan por la mente—muchas distracciones—cuando la otra está hablando. Tenemos que hacer mucha fuerza para escuchar con el objetivo de entender la otra persona y posiblemente estar cambiado por lo que escuchamos.

Recientemente yo leí algo que Padre Richard Rohr escribió sobre la escucha. Hay que tener cuidado al rechazar algo que pensamos que el otro dijo. Puede ser que escuchamos una parte no más de lo que dijo. Al responder o reaccionar demasiado rápidamente al otro será posible que va a cortar la posibilidad de dialogar con respeto. Uno debe querer escuchar al otro y aceptar algunas verdades que posiblemente tiene; merece ser escuchado y tener malentendidos aclarados con compasión. Pero frecuentemente deseamos ganar—estamos con la actitud de tener en nuestras manos la verdad y no extendemos la posibilidad de diálogo.

No estoy diciendo que la otra persona tiene toda la verdad, pero puede ser que parte de su pensamiento y compartir es una verdad para aceptar e incluir con las otras verdades de uno. Hay que escuchar con atención.

¿Es usted capaz de escuchar al otro, aunque no está de acuerdo? Si no es capaz de escuchar al otro, va a estar incapaz de escuchar a Dios. Como bloqueamos a lo que dicen los demás a nosotros, vamos a hacer lo mismo a Dios en oración. La oración no es solamente hablar y hablar a Dios; también es abrir el corazón a Dios y escucharle dentro del corazón. Hay que prestar atención a Dios en los momentos de oración y a lo que dicen otros a nosotros porque a veces Dios está hablándonos por medio de ellos.

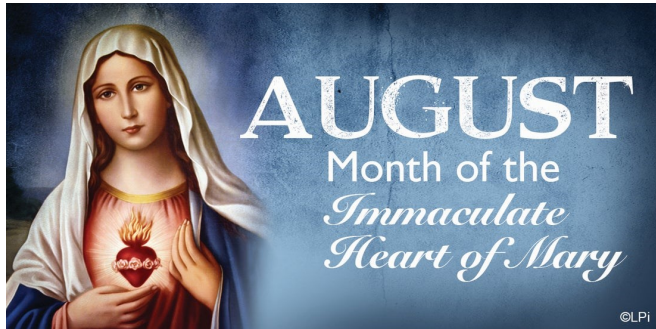
