



Papa Pio X—Comunión Mas Frecuente

Hoy recordamos a San Pio X (papa entre 1903-1914) por ser su fiesta de santo. Él es recordado por su oposición al modernismo en los campos de los estudios bíblicos y la teología. El desconfiaba de las tendencias progresistas y no fue tan abierto como era León XIII. El dirigió la primera codificación del derecho canónico. *El porqué de escribir sobre él ahora es que quizás él es mejor recordado en nuestro tiempo por haber animado a los miembros de la Iglesia, especialmente los niños, a recibir la Comunión más frecuentemente.* Ahora durante este tiempo de avivamiento eucarístico en todo el mundo quiero hablar un poco sobre Pio X porque él quería que la gente aprovechaba mas la oportunidad de recibir la Comunión y así estar más cerca de Jesucristo.



Giuseppe Sarto fue el segundo de los diez hijos de una familia pobre, y él estaba avergonzada de vivir con la pompa de la corte papal. El animaba a los católicos italianos a involucrarse más en la política italiana, y él rechazó la interferencia de gobiernos civiles en los asuntos de la Iglesia.

El introdujo algunas reformas en la liturgia y permitió la práctica de recibir la comunión frecuentemente, y fomentó el acceso de los niños a la Eucaristía. Por esto tenemos que agradecer a Pio X. Pudieron recibir la Comunión cada semana y no solamente unas veces al año. El

promovió mucho el estudio del catecismo y encomendó a un canonista la confección del Código de Derecho para reunir y unificar la legislación eclesiástica. Muy importante a él fueron doctrina y leyes y no tanto el estudio bíblico y una renovación de toda la liturgia. ¡Una lástima! ¿Creen en la presencia real de Cristo en la Eucaristía? ¿Es real o un símbolo?

Family Connection

Families take advantage of Certain days throughout the year to celebrate individuals in the family and to make sure that they know that they are not taken for granted. As a family, recall all of the days that someone in the family was celebrated in the past year-birthdays, Mother's Day, Father's Day, anniversaries, graduations, and so on. Next, challenge each individual to recall what gifts were received on the day(s) on which he or she was celebrated. Emphasize that these days are intended to express appreciation in a special way but are not meant to replace the appreciation that we should always show. Point out how, at times, families Can take one another for granted. Explain that in this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus tells a story about some people who took something for granted and paid a price. Read aloud Luke 13:22-30. Explain that, in this story, some people took it for granted that they could enter the house whenever they wanted, but the master locked the gate and would not let them in after hours. Point out that Jesus was warning his listeners not to assume that they will have eternal life in heaven and not to take this invitation for granted.

As a family, commit to showing appreciation for one another in the days ahead, striving to not take for granted any of the many things that family members do in their roles as parents and Children.


