



Building Strong Catholic Families

A Year of Coming to Know God

Forty days after the Resurrection, Christ returned into Heaven, to be with His Father and reign in glory. There, He acts as our Intercessor. That means that as our human representative before God, He pleads for us, on our behalf. And since He's God and Man, He has a connection to both parties, and can continue His work of bringing both together.
