

Everyday Stewardship



Ember Days for the Eucharistic Revival

EMBER DAYS are the days of prayer and fasting that mark the changing of times and seasons in order to bring about deeper spiritual renewal. On these days, the Church "entreats the Lord for the various needs of humanity" and gives thanks to God for various blessings received (Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the Calendar, 45). Bishop Lucia invites both clergy and the faithful of the diocese to participate in the following Ember Days for the Eucharist Revival, a three-year initiative being undertaken by the USCCB.

March 1st ~ PRAY the Divine Mercy Chaplet FAST from unnecessary verbal communication

March 3rd ~ PRAY for an increase in love and respect for the Blessed Sacrament FAST in addition to abstaining from meat by eating only one full meal (and two smaller meals that together do not equal a full meal)

March 4th ~ PRAY the Litany of Reparation to Sacred Heart FAST from beverages other than water
