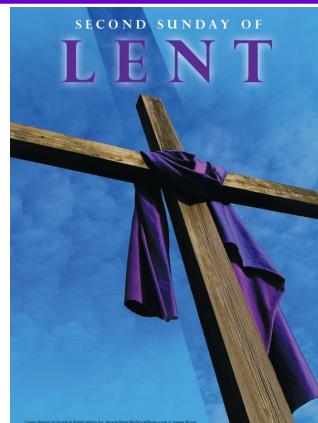

It is not easy to make decisions that require changes in our lives. The older we get, the harder it is to make such decisions. The saying goes, "do not replant the old trees." 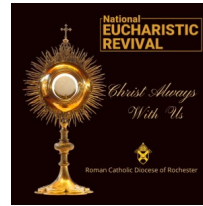
A Year of Coming to Know God

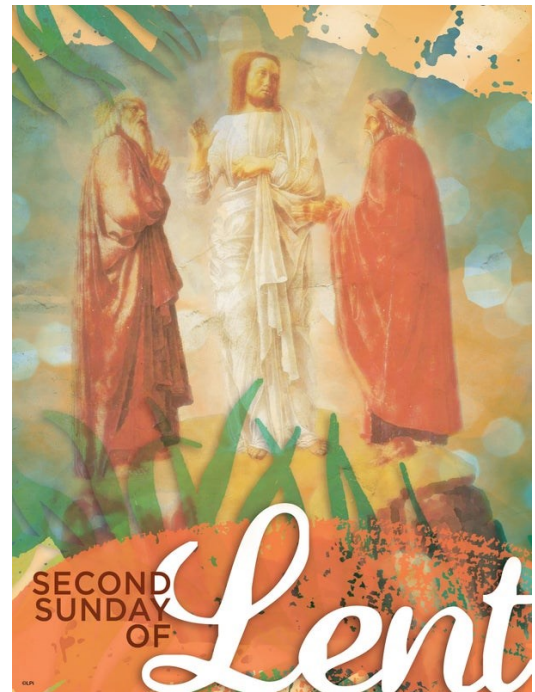
