Fr. Mike's Message...

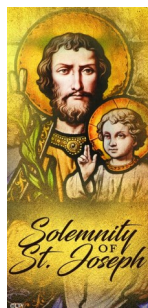
Solemnity of St. Joseph

Next week, the Church celebrates the great feast day of St. Joseph, the patron saint of the entire Roman Catholic Church. Even though it falls during the fasting season of Lent, it is a day of feasting and celebrating, remembering the man who first guided and protected the Holy family and now guides and protects the Church herself. There is a great tradition of celebrating St. Joseph throughout the world, but maybe nowhere more so than in Italy, the spiritual home of the Church.

There are many great traditions surrounding St. Joseph's Day, but perhaps the most famous is the St. Joseph's table. The St. Joseph's table is a tradition that began in Sicily in the 1400's. During that era, a great famine struck the city, with devastating consequences. The tradition holds that the drought was brought to an end with a prayer devotion to St. Joseph himself. In thanksgiving, the people of Sicily came together and had a feast of many kinds of food, meant to be given to the poor who were most affected by the drought. Every year, the people of Sicily would gather together and create a great table of food, and anyone could come and partake from the table. The two stable food traditions around the table is that it is always meatless and there is always bread.

Over the centuries, the St. Joseph's table tradition has spread beyond the borders of Sicily and Italy, and to this day, many parishes continue this tradition in one form or another. As the feast day always falls during Lent, the table is a reminder of one of the great tenets of Lent, of giving alms to the poor, and sharing what we have with those who are less fortunate.

This year, the Altar & Rosary Society of St. Michael's Parish in Newark will be hosting a St. Joseph's table for the parish at around 12pm on Sunday, March 19, which is normally the feast day itself (this year it is officially going to be celebrated on Monday, March 20, because the feast cannot supersede a Sunday of Lent). Whether you can attend the St. Joseph's table in Newark or not, may we take the opportunity on Sunday and Monday to honor St. Joseph, remember what he means to the Church, and use the opportunity to keep serving our brothers and sisters in need this Lenten season.

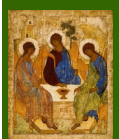

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

When I became the pastor of a large parish, I soon found myself, for the first time in my life, riddled with anxiety, headaches, difficulty making decisions, and fatigue. I called a therapist friend and told her my symptoms and asked if she thought I needed a serious medical exam. She said, "How much water do you drink?" I told her, "I haven't had time to drink water lately." She responded, "You're chronically dehydrated. Drink eighty-five ounces a day and call me in a week." I started guzzling water and in a week all my symptoms went away. I felt great.

Like me, the people in the Exodus wanderings were dehydrated. But unlike me, they knew it. Their symptoms were bad. They fight with each other. They accuse God of being a monster who wants them and their children to die of thirst. Their thirst drives them to plot the bloody assassination of the man who rescued them. God responds by using Moses to strike a rock from which rivers of living waters flow to quench their thirst for years to come.

The Holy Spirit is the living water of love which flows from the pierced side of Jesus, the new Moses. What symptoms in your life suggest you're spiritually dehydrated? Anger at God? Cynicism at your leaders? Bitter rivalry and bickering with others? Don't panic. Of course we have those symptoms. Ask God to provide his water to quench your spiritual thirst, and he will. And all those symptoms will soon disappear.

Building Strong Catholic Families

Lent is a season for repentance. It is a season during which we are called to reflect upon and to live deeply the promises of Baptism. The well and the conversation about water immediately recall for us the Sacrament of Baptism. As the Samaritan woman was converted and sent on a mission because of the conversation about water, we too are converted and sent by our Baptism to preach the good news of Jesus to others. Take this opportunity to reflect upon the importance of Baptism with your family. If you have photos or other mementos of your family's Baptisms, bring them out and take some time to recall the day of Baptism and its importance to you and your family. Create a prayer table that includes these mementos and a bowl of holy water. Pray a prayer of blessing for each member of the family that God will help each one live the promises of his or her Baptism. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.

A Year of Coming to Know God

The Holy Spirit in our souls. The Holy Spirit is the one who internally prompts us:

- First, to recognize Jesus as Lord
- Secondly, to follow Jesus in all things

It is the Holy Spirit who dwells within us when we are in the state of sanctifying grace. Only by His presence and power are we able to live as we ought. Many people may feel as though they don't know the Spirit – but that's because He's too close to see. He's the one we owe all our merits and virtues too, and it is He who makes our being holy (by Baptism) and our action holy (by Confirmation).

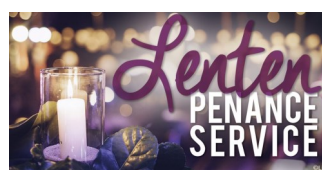
