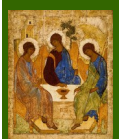

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Today we begin the celebration of Holy Week. In front of us is a time of intense reflection on the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection. **Let us consider this time as a gift given to us from God which brings us closer together with Jesus, apart from whom there is no life for us. The time of Holy Week is a test of our fidelity.** It is easy for us to be with Jesus when he works miracles and shows his omnipotence, but *will it be as easy for us to be with him at the time of his rejection, humiliation, and death?*

In a relationship with Jesus, it is like relationships with people. **If my love is true, then I want to be with a loved one not only when he is healthy and in full force, but above all when he suffers and needs my affectionate presence.** The suffering of a loved one is always a test to my fidelity. Such moments show what kind of man I am. Suffering is a test for my humanity. The suffering of Jesus is a test to my Christianity.

If Easter is only an occasion for us to have fun, eat and drink, then this situation should deeply embarrass us. I am pleased that commercialization has not touched Easter. There are only bunnies and eggs, but nothing else. It was as if we were embarrassed to squeeze more into it. There are no flashy lights in the streets, no gifts, only the naked truth confronting us with the reality of the suffering of the Son of God, who loves us so much that he gives himself for us. *What attitude will you take to this truth? Will it touch your heart on Easter?*

I wish you, my friends, a fruitful experience of the Passover Triduum. Do not be afraid to be close to Jesus' suffering, look at the cross, and contemplate the faithful love of God, which nowhere speaks as strongly as in the crucified Christ.

PS. I will be in Poland from April 24 to May 12 to spend time with my father and my siblings and my 12 nieces and nephews. So, I'm asking you for your prayers for safe travels.

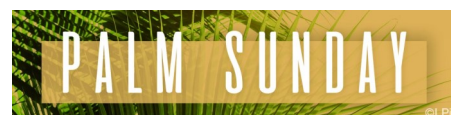

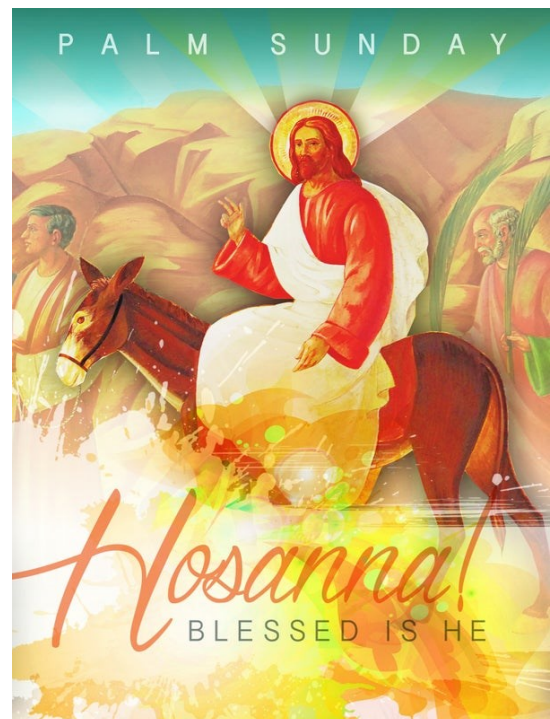

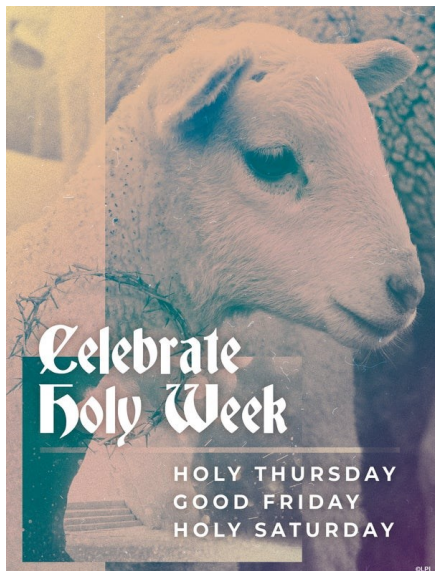

Making Way for God

As Christ reclined at the Passover meal and his impending be-
 trayal, I have to imagine at least one of the disciples thought to
 himself, incredulously and perhaps even indignantly: *And
 you're not going to do anything about it?*

So often we expect God to behave like the frantic parent of a
 teenager, banging down the closed door of a bedroom filled
 with loud music. We expect him to be overbearing, snooping in
 our diary and waiting to ground us the minute we break curfew,
 desperate to keep us within the family fold, ready and willing
 to use judgment and force to do so.

It's true that God greatly desires us to stay in friendship with
 him. But to accomplish it, he does not come to us as a meddler
 or an overlord. He comes in the same way he does on Palm
 Sunday. He waits for us to make way.

He may not be overbearing, but he is still
 devoted, and unfailingly patient. As the
 Palm Sundays of our lives — the mo-
 ments of our devotion and piety — give
 way to the Holy Thursdays, when we
 inevitably deny him, God does not aban-
 don us. The sacrifice on the cross is still
 there, waiting for us to accept it.

Say to daughter Zion, "Behold, your king
 comes to you, meek and riding on an ass,
 and on a colt, the foal of a beast of bur-
 den." — Matthew 21:5





Building Strong Catholic Families

Palm, or Passion, Sunday begins the most sacred week of the Church year—Holy Week. During these days, we prepare ourselves for Easter by prayerful reflection upon the events of Jesus' Passion and death. You might display a crucifix in a prominent place this week, as reminder of the salvation Christ won for us. The crucifix can also be the focal point for family prayer during Holy Week. Because of the length and complexity of the Passion narrative, young children have difficulty remaining attentive when it is proclaimed in its entirety. Families can choose to read a portion of this Sunday's Gospel each day of Holy Week, providing ample opportunity for children to ask questions and respond to the events described there. In this way, the entire week can become a "way of the cross." Each day during Holy Week, the family can gather in a prayerful space with a crucifix as the focal point.

A Year of Coming to Know God

If the Church is Christ's body, then that has some major implications: a. First of all, a body is visible (by definition, a body is something material, something tangible). So the Church can't just be an "invisible community of all believers." It has to be a concrete institution.

b. Secondly, a body is organized (a body, after all, has organs, and all the parts of the body are precisely coordinated to work together). So it doesn't make sense for a Christian to say, "I don't believe in organized religion."

c. Thirdly, a body is how you relate to a person. A man can't say to his wife, "I want to have a relationship with you, but I don't want your body to get in the way. I don't want to see, or touch, or hear your body." So too, if the Church is Christ's body, it doesn't make sense to say, "I want a relationship with Christ, but I don't want the Church to get in the way." The Church is precisely how you have a relationship with Christ.
