Fr. Mike's Message



EASTER SUNDAY

Happy Easter!

It has been a long 40+ day journey for all of us. The season of lent is meant to be a season of sacrifice, purification, and fasting. We do this during Lent as a way to work on ourselves, remembering that the Lord asked us to work on our own struggles with sin rather than complaining about others. The season of Lent is a gift from the

Church to help us to grow in

holiness, as well as preparation for what we just celebrated over the last few days. The Triduum (Holy Thursday through Holy Saturday) is the culmination of Lent, when we recall the events of Jesus' passion and death. Our season of sacrifice helps to unite us to the Cross of Christ on Good Friday.

But now we have finally come to the end of that journey. The season of Lent also prepares us for the season of Easter that we now celebrate. Indeed, the time for fasting is at an end, and the time for feasting has begun. Our season of sacrifice makes the season of celebration that much more special. Hopefully, this Lenten season has helped draw closer to the Lord, that our relationship with him has been deepened and further developed. This closeness with the Lord helps to make the Easter season mean so much more. We feel like we have been on the same journey with Christ and are rising with him in triumph today.

Today we begin the 50-day celebration of Easter. In many ways, Lent and Easter are two different sides of the same coin. Both seasons are meant to bring us closer to Christ, to help us to grow in holiness, and to remember our call to discipleship. We just do it in different ways in Easter than in Lent. Instead of fasting, we feast. Instead of sorrow, there is joy. Instead of a somber tone, it's a celebratory tone. Both the Lenten journey and the Easter journey are important and necessary in our lives of faith.

However and wherever you choose to celebrate Easter today, I hope that this day, and the days that follow, are a time of joy and celebration for you. After all, Christ has indeed truly risen from the dead. He has triumphed over sin, over Satan, and even over death itself, and has won the victory for us all. As fellow heirs in the promise, Christ's victory over the grave has ensured for all of us a spot with Christ in the Heavenly Kingdom. He is risen. Alleluia!

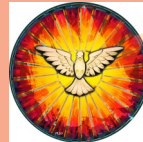

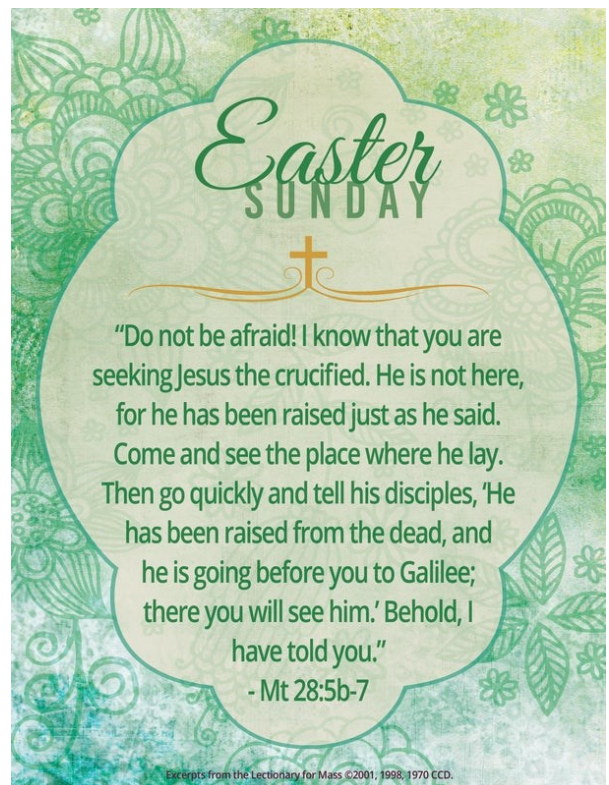

Building Strong Catholic Families

In the Easter Gospel we hear about how the disciples found the tomb empty three days after Jesus' death. We are also told that they do not yet understand the Scriptures or that Jesus had been raised from the dead. That understanding gradually unfolded for the disciples as they began to experience the risen Lord. Similarly, our understanding of Jesus' Resurrection unfolds for us throughout our lives. In the weeks ahead, we will hear how the first disciples moved from confusion, doubt, and skepticism to faith. Their experience can teach us how we too might receive this gift of faith from God.

A Year of Coming to Know God

What does the Church do?

The Church is the community of believers, but every community needs leadership, that's why Jesus gave us Peter and the Apostles, and they in turn appointed successors (the popes and the bishops), to direct the Church until Christ should come again. Under this leadership of the Pope and Bishops, the Church fulfills three tasks. The first is teaching. The Church keeps safe the truths of revelation. The teaching authority of the Church makes sure that our faith is never corrupted, never contradicts itself, and never invents a new teaching that isn't based on the original witness of Scripture and the Apostles
