

Fr. Mike's Message...



Corpus Christi

With Pentecost behind us, the Church moves out of Easter Season and into Ordinary Time for the rest of the Summer and Fall. However, that does not mean that our celebrations come to an end. This week-

end, the Church celebrates Trinity Sunday, when we recognize and honor the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. The fact that God is one nature in three persons might seem crazy to some, but for us, it is the very heart of our Christian faith.

Next weekend, the celebrations continue. The week after Trinity Sunday every year, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, more commonly known as Corpus Christi. Now, of course, we celebrate the Eucharist every time we celebrate the Mass. But the reason why we have this feast day is to mark an entire Mass dedicated to the Eucharist itself, where even the Scripture readings and Mass prayers reflect on the Institution of the Eucharist by Christ. Now, we do celebrate the Institution of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday, but having a feast day for the Eucharist outside of Holy Week and the Triduum allows us to celebrate the Mystery fully in a spirit

The origin of the feast day comes from St. Juliana of Liege. St. Juliana was a nun who lived in the 13th Century. As a child, she has been orphaned and was raised by the same group of nuns whom she would join when she got older. When she was 16, St. Juliana began having the same vision multiple times. In her vision, she saw a full moon with a dark spot or stripe in the middle of it. Over time, she came to understand that the brightness of the moon represented the Church, but the dark spot represented the lack of a feast day dedicated to the Holy Eucharist. St. Juliana kept this vision secret for many years before revealing it to a few trusted friends and spiritual advisors. Eventually, after her death in 1258, Pope Urban IV instituted the Feast of Corpus Christi on the Universal Calendar of the Church in 1264.

Adoration of the Eucharist is of vital importance to the Church. This has always been the case, but it is especially true in the modern day. If you recall, last year the Bishops of the United States instituted what they called a three-year Eucharistic Revival. Year 2 of this revival begins today with the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, as we transition from the "Year of the Diocese" to the "Year of the Parish". During this past year, we as a cluster have had several events looking to foster devotion to the Eucharist, including the 40-hour celebration last fall, my talks on the Eucharist in the scriptures this past spring, and some increases in Eucharistic Adoration. We will continue to have more programs and events this coming year, and I would ask everyone to continue to keep an eye out for them as this year goes on. May we continue to keep Christ at the center of our life, and may we always remember to adore and worship Him in the Blessed Sacrament, the Most Holy Eucharist.

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

Years ago, a woman at daily Mass approached me in the communion procession. She had her arms crossed, indicating she wanted a blessing instead of the Sacred Host. She had tears in her eyes. I gave her a little blessing. She returned the next day. And the next. The same thing repeated. After a few weeks, I asked her why she didn't receive Holy Communion. She said she wasn't Catholic yet and was preparing to become so. I asked her why she wanted to be Catholic. She said, "Because I long to be in a real communion with Christ and with everyone I love." That, I submit, is a darn good reason. A few months later, she became Catholic and received the Body and Blood of Christ with unspeakably great joy and still does to this day.

Saint Paul says of the Eucharistic bread, "Is it not a participation in the body of Christ?" For Paul, the answer is obvious. Yes, it is exactly that. Which is why he can say, "we, though many, are one body." Jesus is truly, really, and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist. This is no magic trick, but a mystery of our salvation. He feeds us with the Sacrament of his body so that our communion with him — and with the other members of his body — is built up and becomes mature. That's why the Eucharist quenches our deep thirst for love and communion. The Body and Blood of Christ is the best reason to be Catholic. It's our participation of love in the one we love.



The Heart of Stewardship

What else is there to give when one has already given away one's body and one's life? What more can one say or do to demonstrate love for another when all one had has been given to another? This total giving of self to

loved ones cannot be trumped by flowery words or material gifts that are fleeting. This is the ultimate in love. This is the love Jesus had for us on the way to his Passion, at the institution of the Holy Eucharist. This is the love he has for us daily in the celebration of the Mass on altars in every church, in every city, in every nation on earth. No one can give more. No one can ask for more. This is the true heart of Christian stewardship.

If you take the time to gaze upon your God in the simplest of forms and begin to reflect on what has actually taken place with bread and wine becoming the presence of the Divine, then you can begin to understand true humility, sacrifice, and love. And when you have the privilege to take that Real Presence into your body at the meal where you are an honored guest, you become one with the One who is the embodiment of stewardship.

Then, you must ask yourself, "How can I even begin to reflect the love that I have encountered at this feast?" Building Strong Catholic Families

Our faith teaches us that when we gather to celebrate Mass, Jesus is present to us. The bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Christ. This is what we mean by the word transubstantiation: Jesus makes himself

present to all who receive the Body and Blood of Christ. If there are children in your family who have already celebrated their First Holy Communion, invite them to share their memories of this special day. If there are family photos taken on this occasion, bring them out and share them together. Adults in the family may also share memories or photos that they have of their First Communion. Then read together today's Gospel, John 6:51–58. Reflect together on what Jesus means when he calls himself the "living bread." Recall that every time we receive the Eucharist, Jesus keeps the promise he made in today's Gospel—those who eat his flesh and drink his blood will remain forever connected to him. Perhaps family members can share what it means for them to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. Together thank God for this gift of Holy Communion. Pray together the Lord's Prayer or today's Psalm.
