

#### The Catholic Bubble

There's a dangerous myth that exists among pockets of faithful, observant Catholic families. I call it the Legend of the Catholic Bubble.

Here's how the legend goes: you find a devout Catholic parish and a devout Catholic community filled with devout Catholic people who care about devout Catholic things, and you stay away from everything and everyone else, you and your children will be safe from the influence of the evil one. Your children will never fall away from the faith, or even be tempted, and your own faith will stay steel-strong amidst the many tempests and trials of this earthly life.

But like the Loch Ness Monster and the Abominable Snowman, it's all made up.

Don't misunderstand me: I love a good devout Catholic parish. I live for a supportive, devout Catholic community. It's one of the biggest blessings in the Christian life, and I cannot overstate how helpful it is to raise children in an environment that upholds your Catholic faith and does not denigrate it.

Make no mistake: the Catholic Bubble will not save you. The trials and the temptations will find you there, too: on the parish council, at Catholic school, in your Catholic moms' group. No community on earth is so supportive that it mimics Heaven. The weeds have been sown with the good seed, and the harvest time is not yet upon us.

Cherish your community, certainly - but beware of the lure of the Catholic Bubble. We are called to be yeast in the loaf of bread, and yeast is nothing on

Taken together, the parables found in today's Gospel offer both a sobering reminder about the Kingdom of God and words of encouragement. As the wheat and the weeds must grow together until the harvest, so we may not know whether our ac-

tions contribute to God's Kingdom until God's final judgment. With this word of Caution in mind, we act always in prayer that our actions will be consistent with God's plans. In the parables of the mustard seed and the yeast, we hear words of encouragement. God can bring the Kingdom of Heaven from even the smallest of beginnings. Thus, we ask God to work through us for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven.

Set aside some time this week to make bread with your family. Show the amount of yeast that is required to raise an entire batch of bread. Observe that little things can go a long way. After the bread has been baked, gather together as a family. Read together today's Gospel, Matthew 13:24-43.

Reflect together on what Jesus means when he teaches that the Kingdom of Heaven is like a mustard seed and like yeast. In these parables, Jesus is teaching us that God can work wonders from even the smallest beginnings of the Kingdom of God. This means that even the little things that we do can make a big difference in the lives of others. What are some of the little things that we Can do in our family that help to make things better for others? Decide on one action to take together. Pray that God will use your action to make a difference in the world. Pray together the Lord's Prayer.

#### "I am the bread of life." John 6:51



The Mass, or more precisely, The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, is the most important, central, and sacred act of worship in the Catholic Church. This is because the Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of Christian Life" (Lumen Gentium; 1964). Catholics believe that during the Mass, the priest changes

the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ, called the Holy Eucharist, which describes the liturgical act of worship itself or the result or fruit of it. Catholics profess that the Holy Eucharist can only happen by means of the Mass, and they give the same respect and adoration to the Holy Eucharist that's due to God. So, it makes sense that the Mass is central to Catholicism. It's not the only thing we do or believe, but it's the center of our belief as we firmly maintain that Jesus Christ is really, truly, and present in the Holy Eucharist. During The National Eucharistic Revival I will write a short column in our Parish Bulletin each week, to help us understand all the various parts of the Mass and enter it in a deeper and spiritual way each Sunday when we gather.
