19TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Importance of Prayer

In this week's Gospel we encounter a profound event that is full of depth and meaning. Contextually, this event follows the miracle of the feeding of the five-thousand. Following that miracle we hear today Jesus sending His Apostles to the other side of the lake. Upon crossing the lake they encounter mighty winds and violent waves. They then see Jesus walking on the water towards them. Peter then asks to join Jesus on the water, but becomes afraid, he doubts, then begins to sink until Jesus lifts him up and calms the sea.

Yet before all of this Jesus does something of utmost importance that is easy to miss. Before our Lord walks on water and calms the sea we find Him in prayer. Recall the verse from near the beginning of this Gospel section that says, "he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone.'

The very first act of our Lord in this Gospel section of mighty deeds and miracles is that of prayer; the very first thing that Jesus does before all else is to pray. This should tell us something of the importance of prayer and the need for us to do so regularly. Yet prayer can often be a difficult concept to grasp.

What helps me is to think of prayer as an encounter and dialogue with the living God. In prayer we come face-toface with the loving Creator of all and discourse with Him; we share ourselves and our hearts with Him and ultimately come to know not only Him better, but ourselves as well. In prayer we are conversing with a God who delights in hearing from us.

Yet however we pray, whether it be prayers from our rich tradition (The Lord's Prayer, the Hail Mary, the Memorare, the Rosary...), meditating on Bible passages, heartfelt discourse with Jesus, etc., etc., the most important thing is that we do pray. As Jesus has shown us in this section from Matthew, it is essential that we take some regular time to encounter and converse with our Lord. To get to know better Him who desires nothing more than to reveal Himself more deeply to us.







Gospel Meditation Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

A man at my parish was struggling to overcome a habitual sin. He said to me, "Father, I know the chance that I will commit sin again is really high. Why should I keep confessing my sins? Isn't that dishonest?" Anyone who has felt the tyrannical power of sin — and who hasn't? — has pondered this kind of question.

I responded to him, "What was the probability Peter would walk on the stormy water?" After some silence, he said, "Zero. But when Jesus called, he did it." I could tell my penitent friend was re-framing the question from his own weakness to the greatness of the Lord's love for him. The question for us should not be one of human probabilities about our sin, but rather whether or not we will trust the Lord's grace in our lives.

This week the Lord is calling you and me to do the impossible: overcome sin with love. The only way to do that is to trust he is calling, and then to walk with the eyes of faith locked on him. And if we sink, he will raise us up again and again. Of that, we can be 100% sure.
