The Penitential Rite

There are two main parts of the Mass, the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist but let's take a closer look at the very beginning of Mass. We start the Mass in song offering praise and thanksgiving to the God who made us. The priest greets us and we return the greeting *The Lord be with you! And with your spirit!* But what happens then? We immediately come before God to confess our sins, to offer our heartfelt repentance for our offenses. We call this the Penitential Rite. This is so very important. In fact, the earliest mention of the Lord's Supper in the New Testament refers to how important this is. St Paul writes in his first letter to the Corinthians in about the year 56 A.D. and gives them this charge: "Therefore, whoever eats the Bread or drinks the Cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the Bod and Blood of the Lord. *A person should examine himself and so eat the Bread and drink the Cup.* For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the Body, eats and drinks judgement on himself. That is why many among you are ill an infirm and a considerable number are dying." Even in the very earliest days of the Church, the need for repentance before Communion was emphasized. The importance of this is so significant that it is the only time in the New Testament that sickness is mentioned as a punishment for sin! It's so easy to recite the prayers of the Mass automatically so I would like to give you (and me!) a challenge — a two part challenge. First, the next time you are at Mass, think about how our time of repentance comes even before we offer our praise in the Gloria or hear the Scriptures read. Secondly, consider this: When we pray we not only address God but even our fellow believers, our fellow worshippers: "I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God." That means that you should be praying not only for yourself but for everyone worshipping and repenting of their sins. Consider this: Jesus' first command was *Repent and believe in the Gospel.* (Mark 1:15) Let us pray for *one another* asking for the Lord's forgiveness.

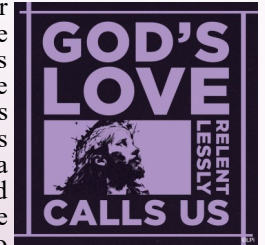
The Return of Coffee Hour/Dinners

Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

I confess that I have a soft spot for the scary things Jesus says because they are usually ignored. But there's gold in them thar hills, if we have courage to look. This week Jesus gives us a terrifying warning in his parable about the king who gives a marriage feast for his son and promptly goes berserk when people don't respond. The point: those who do not properly respond to God's generous invitation will face totally devastating consequences. The invitees who don't show up get their city burned to the ground. The poor homeless man is tortured for not wearing the correct clothes. Scary indeed.



Is Jesus trying to intimidate or bully us into following him? No, because that is certainly not how he treats anyone in the Gospels. A better view is this: to Jesus, your life matters. The Universe is not an empty wasteland where anything goes. It is a theater of love offered and either accepted or rejected. How easy it can be to glide through life thinking my life doesn't make a difference. But it does. It really does.

This should not only be sobering but exhilarating. The positive side of the negative in Jesus' scary parables is the thrill and joy that he is inviting us, therefore our lives matter a great deal. There is a reason to get up in the morning. God's generous love is relentlessly calling us. True, obstinately saying no through our indifference is a catastrophe for us and those around us. But how wonderful must the consequences of our "yes" be?

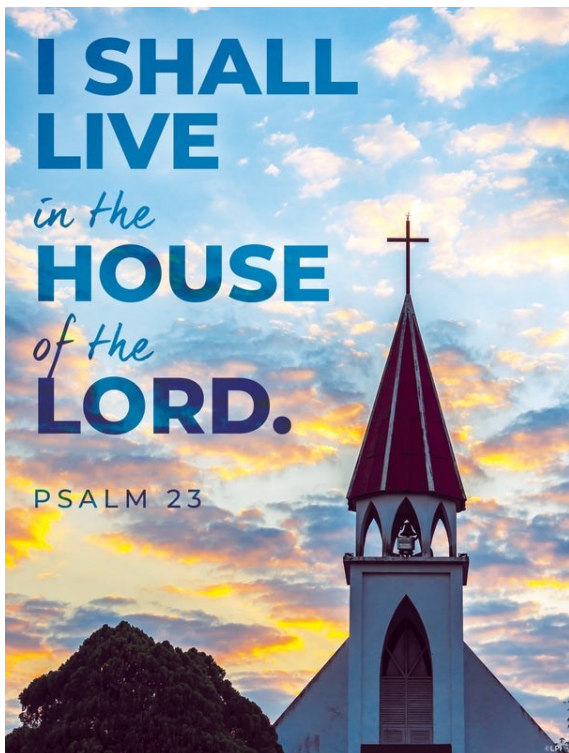

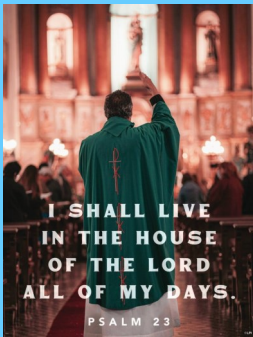

Today's Gospel reminds us that God invites all of us to his kingdom. How do we respond to this invitation? In theological terms, God has granted us free will to accept or reject salvation. The parable of the wedding feast reminds us that God desires our wholehearted acceptance of his invitation to salvation.

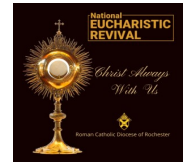
As you gather as a family, discuss what you consider appropriate attire for various occasions. For example, if your family were invited to a neighbor's barbecue, what would you wear? If you were planning to attend the symphony, what might you wear? If invited to an evening wedding, what might you wear? Discuss how our preparations for an event and our choice of attire indicates the importance and value we place on the occasion. In today's Gospel Jesus uses this metaphor to talk about the kingdom of heaven. Read Matthew 22:1-14. Discuss why the guest was thrown out of the wedding feast. What does Jesus expect of those who accept his invitation of salvation? What would be the evidence of our conversion to God's salvation? Pray together as a family that you will respond wholeheartedly to God's invitation to salvation. Pray together today's psalm, Psalm 23.



"I am the bread of life." John 6:51

After the Gloria, an opening prayer addresses all three persons of the Holy Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) and usually sets the tone for the rest of the prayers and Scripture readings at Mass. It begins by the priest saying, "Let us pray," and pauses for silence. Moments of silence provide space for a deeper experience of God's presence. **The priest gathers or collects our prayers in the opening prayer which is called the Collect.** Every Sunday, holy day, and feast day (honoring a saint) has its own unique prayers and readings, depending on the time of year or priority of the feast. During each element of the Liturgy of the Word that I've described so far, the priest, deacon, altar servers, and congregation stand throughout. Sincerely, Fr. Felicjan
