





Children learn about love from real, concrete examples witnessed in family life. We can help children to love God and love their neighbors by showing everyday acts of love, generosity, and

show to other people. On the poster, use pictures and words to show some of the ways that your family shows their love for other people. Pray together that your family will continue to express your love for




God by loving others. Pray the Act of Love.

#### "I am the bread of life." John 6:51

Usually, a musical arrangement of the word Alleluia is sung just before the reading of the Gospel, a passage from the New Testament Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John. Alleluia is the Latin version of the Greek word alleluia, an expression of praise and joy that, in turn, comes from the Hebrew hallelujah for praise the Lord. This is the high point of the Bible readings, and it's the cue for the congregation and ministers to stand. This change from sitting to standing shows the preeminence of the Gospels in relation to the other books of the Bible. The entire Bible is inspired, but the Gospels are special, because they contain the very words and deeds of Christ. So, Catholics stand when the Gospels are read, but remain seated, while the other parts of the Bible are read at Mass. Only a deacon, priest, or bishop can read the Gospel at Mass. Sincerely, Fr.
