32<sup>ND</sup> SUNDAY  
 IN ORDINARY TIME

“Lord, Lord, open the door for us! But he said in reply, ‘Amen, I say to you, I do not know you.’”  
 - Mt 25:11-12

So here we are in the middle of November. In a couple of short weeks we will usher in the Advent Season and begin a new liturgical year. As this liturgical year comes to an end with the Solemnity of Christ the King on the 26<sup>th</sup>, I thought this would be a good opportunity to go over the liturgical seasons of the Church.\*

*The liturgical year is made up of six seasons:*

- Advent - four weeks of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' birth*
- Christmas - recalling the Nativity of Jesus Christ and his manifestation to the peoples of the world*
- Lent - a six-week period of penance before Easter*
- Sacred Paschal Triduum - the holiest "Three Days" of the Church's year, where the Christian people recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus*
- Easter - 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his sending forth of the Holy Spirit*
- Ordinary Time - divided into two sections (one span of 4-8 weeks after Christmas Time and another lasting about six months after Easter Time), wherein the faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and works among his people. The mystery of Christ, unfolded through the cycle of the year, calls us to live his mystery in our own lives. This call is best illustrated in the lives of Mary and the saints, celebrated by the Church throughout the year. There is no tension between the mystery of Christ and the celebration of the saints, but rather a marvelous harmony. The Blessed Virgin Mary is joined by an inseparable bond to the saving work of her Son, and the feasts of all the saints proclaim the wonderful works of Christ in his servants and offer the faithful fitting examples for their imitation.*

*Each liturgical year begins on the First Sunday of Advent during the preceding calendar year (i.e., the First Sunday of Advent in 2022 began the 2023 liturgical year).*

Hope it's not too soon to wish you a Happy Thanksgiving and a Blessed Advent Season!

*Family* "In the daily activities of family life, we can easily find excuses for not attending to our spiritual lives. If not given top priority, prayer and reading Scripture risk becoming occasional activities rather than daily practices. In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds us that if we fail to give our spiritual life priority, we will find ourselves unprepared to receive Jesus. Daily prayer and spiritual practice keeps us ready to receive Jesus. Gather together as a family and talk about some of the things our faith calls us to do every day and every week to keep God first in our lives. Talk about what might happen if we don't do these things regularly. Explain to your family that Jesus taught us that it is important to keep ourselves ready to receive him when he comes again. Tell them to listen as you read the parable that Jesus tells in today's Gospel. Read aloud Matthew 25:1-13. Talk with your family about why Jesus says that it is so important to remain ready to receive the Kingdom of Heaven. Pray together that your family will always keep God first in your lives so that you will all be prepared to receive Jesus when he comes. Pray together the Act of Hope.

*O my God, relying on your infinite mercy and promises, I hope to obtain pardon of my sins, the help of your grace, and life everlasting, through the merits of Jesus Christ, my Lord and Redeemer. Amen.*

At Mass, the congregation doesn't need to bring a Bible and follow along, because the priest, deacon, and lector read aloud from the Lectionary - a book that meets the specific needs of the Catholic Mass. The Lectionary only contains biblical readings, but they are arranged in a different order than the Bible. The Bible begins with Genesis and ends with Revelation. The lectionary, however, begins with the Scripture readings for the first Sunday of the **new church calendar year, in Advent, and ends on the last Sunday of Ordinary Time, when we celebrate Christ The King.** The Lectionary lists the readings for the first Sunday of Year A - an Old Testament reading, a Psalm, a New Testament Epistle, and a Gospel - followed by the readings for the first Sunday of liturgical year B and then Year C. The readings for the second Sunday of Year A, B, and C then follow the readings for the first Sunday, and so on. The Lectionary is nothing more than the Bible selections put together in such a way so that the person reading the Sacred Scriptures only has to read one- or two-pages side by side instead of going back and forth from one end of the Bible to the other, trying to find the chapter and verse needed. The Lectionary conveniently organizes the Scripture readings Sunday-by-Sunday and weekday-by-weekday.
