




The Return of Coffee Hour/Dinners

"I am the bread of life." John 6:51

One thing I love about our celebration of Sunday Mass is that no matter which country in the world you are in, you will hear the same Scripture readings proclaimed in its native tongue, in all Catholic Churches. It is truly a great witness that we are a one, holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. We are all brothers and sisters, united in the Word of God. The Roman Missal is the official book the priest uses at Mass, containing all the prayers that he must say as well as telling him what to do and how to do it. The proclamation of the Gospel is the high point of the Liturgy of the Word. If you listen closely to the Sunday Mass readings, the first reading from the Old Testament and the Gospel have a connection. Simply put, the message we hear in the Old Testament reading is fulfilled through the words and actions of Jesus proclaimed in the Gospel. Before the Deacon proclaims the Gospel, he stands in front of the Priest and bows his head and says, "*Father give me your blessing*." The priest holds his hands over the Deacon's head and says, "*May the Lord* be in your heart and in your mind to proclaim His Gospel worthy and well." The Priest then blesses the Deacon. The Deacon makes the sign of the cross and answers "amen" and proceeds to the pulpit or ambo. The Gospel is introduced by the Deacon or Priest with the greeting, "the Lord be with you," and the congregation responds, "and with your spirit." The announcement of the Gospel writer is announced, and a sign of the cross, with the thumb, is made over the Gospel page of the Lection-ary, while the Deacon or Priest, along with the congregation make a signing of the cross, with their thumb over the forehead, lips and heart,

and silently pray, "may the Word of God be on my mind, on my lips and in my heart." At the conclusion of the Gospel, "The Gospel of the Lord," is expressed, the Lectionary is reverenced with a kiss, and the Deacon or Priest silently prays, "*May the Gospel* cleanse us of our sins."
