DECEMBER 3. 2023 FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT



Dear Parishioners,

The season of Advent developed in the Church over time. Here are some facts that you may not know about the roots and meanings of Advent:

*Advent is a time of expectation and preparation for the birth of the Lord. The word "Advent" derives from the Latin

word "adventus," which means "coming," and is associated with the four weeks of preparation for Christmas.

* Advent has a changing start date, but it always contains four Sundays. It starts on the Sunday closest to the feast of St. Andrew the Apostle, (November 30th). It can begin as early as November 27th or as late as December 3rd.

*Advent marks the beginning of the liturgical year. Advent was chosen to begin the year as representative of the time in history that Christ was not known to us. With His birth the beginning of our faith was founded. The liturgical year ends with the feast of Christ the King, His reign over the universe.

* The Advent season has two meanings. It emphasizes both the celebration of Christ coming into the world as a man and also the second coming when the Lord will return again. The traditional color of Advent is purple or violet, which symbolizes the penitential spirit.

* Hope is a predominant theme of Advent. The Israelites hoped for a Messiah to come, and Christ entered the world. We are hopeful for the arrival of Christ again into the world. * Advent is a reminder of the Old Testament promises of the coming of the Messiah. The Advent tradition of the Jesse Tree consists of symbols of the Messiah coming from the line of Jesse.

* Advent focuses on light as opposed to darkness. Christ enters our dark world and casts away the darkness of sin to redeem us. He will come again as the light of the world.

* Advent has two parts. The first portion the First Sunday of Advent until December 16th is preparation for the second coming of Christ. The second portion from December 17th to the 24th directly prepares us for the commemoration of the first coming of Christ, Christmas.

This year the fourth Sunday of Advent will be December 24th, which is also Christmas Eve. Please don't forget you still need to fulfill your Sunday obligation by going to our regular Sunday Masses. Then coming back in the evening for our Christmas Eve Masses or Monday morning Christmas Day. The Mass schedule for the entire cluster is inside the bulletin.

After standing for the Gospel, the congregation sits and listens to the homily, which is different than a sermon. So often, the terms homily and sermon are used interchangeably. Most people think they mean the same, but there is a slight difference. **Sermon**: Any explanation and reflection on the Word of God. **Homily:** A reflection that's preached at Mass after the Gospel and is read, and only read, by clergy - deacons, priests, or bishops. According to canon law, the local bishop may allow laity and religious brothers and sisters to preach a sermon under certain conditions, but they're never allowed to preach the homily itself. **During** the homily, the priest, deacon or bishop connects the Scripture readings at Mass, to the daily lives of the people, the teaching of the Church, or the particular celebration at hand, such as a wedding or funeral. We are nearing the conclusion of the first half of the Mass, called the Liturgy of the Word. Over the next few weeks we will conclude with the Reciting of the Nicene Creed and the Praying of the General Intercessions or sometimes called the Prayer of the Faithful. Sincerely, Fr. Felicjan
