DECEMBER 10, 2023 SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

The word "Advent" in English comes from the Latin word *adventus*, which means "coming." It's called this because during Advent we, as one body, are called to await expectantly for the coming of Christ in subtle ways.

The first is the coming of the Christ-child at Christmas when we participate in, acknowledge, and celebrate the birth of Jesus in our time. On Christmas we celebrate the specific time when the Savior of the world was born in a humble manger. During Advent we prepare for this.

The second is the expectation that we have of Our Lord's second-coming. During Advent we have the opportunity to remember that our Lord has promised to return. We have the chance to remind ourselves to be joyfully vigilant as we await His second coming.

The third is the coming of Christ's birth in our hearts. In Advent we have the occasion to recall that Christ lives in the heart of every child of God; to trust the words of St. Paul when he assured us that Jesus will make his home in our hearts if we trust in Him (Ephesians 3:17).

In the Gospel today we hear John the Baptist urge his listeners to "prepare the way of the Lord." So now, as we begin this second week in Advent, let us recognize the chance that we have to ask ourselves how well we are preparing for the coming of Christ. How well am I preparing for the Christ-child's arrival on Christmas? How well am I preparing myself for his return? And how well am I preparing for him to be born in my heart?





On Sundays and Solemnities the homily is followed by the Creed (Profession of Faith), which is ordinarily the ancient Nicene Creed of A.D. 325. The Apostles Creed, an ancient symbol of Baptism, may be used during Lent and Easter time and occasionally at Masses for children. The entire congregation stands to recite or sometime sing the Creed. At the words, "by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man" all make a profound bow to show reverence for the Incarnation, from the Latin word "caro" for flesh. The Incarnation refers to Jesus' taking on human flesh - being conceived in the womb of the Blessed Virgin Mary. On Solemnities of the Annunciation (March 25) and Christmas (December 25), all kneel instead of just bowing. The Creed concisely sums up all that the Magisterium (the teaching authority of the Church) has taught for the past 2,000 years. Fr. Felicjan
