


Today's Gospel describes how Jesus Called his first disciples and the immediacy with which these men dropped everything to follow him. We can only begin to

imagine what Jesus' presence must have been like to invoke such a response in these first disciples. While a few of us might relate to such a radical conversion, many of us would find such a sudden change in ourselves or in another person unsettling. There are few things for which we would willingly drop everything. And yet this is the immediacy with which these first disciples responded to Jesus. These first disciples were willing to drop everything in order to make Jesus and the Kingdom of God the most important things in their lives.

Gather as a family and talk about circumstances in which you have had to "drop everything." (the Call to pick up a sick child from school, the cry of a hurt or angry Child) How did you feel about having to change your plans in each of these situations? How do we feel when someone asks us to drop everything to help him or her? For many of us, it is not easy to drop everything to respond to the needs of another. Read today's Gospel, Mark 1:14-20. Invite your family to imagine what Jesus' presence and invitation to these first followers must have been like that they responded by leaving their livelihood to become his disciples. How might our life change if we understood the Kingdom of God to be as important and immediate in our lives? Ask God to help you experience the Kingdom of God with such immediacy.

Pray together the Lord's Prayer.

"I am the bread of life." John 6:51

After the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy), the congregation kneels for the first time. The Eucharistic Prayer is part of the Mass which only the priest can say. However, I meditate in silence and ponder each word, and encourage you to do the same. The Eucharistic Prayer recalls what happened at the Last Supper. The sequence of events is retold until the part where Jesus takes the bread. Then the priest changes from third person to first person and speaks as if Christ himself were standing on-site holding the host. The priest acts in the person of Christ (in persona Christi) as another Christ (alter Christus). The priest doesn't say "This is Christ's body" or "This is Jesus' blood." He uses the same pronoun, My, because at the moment of consecration, the priest is Jesus. The priest uses the same words that Jesus used at the Last Supper (Mathew 26:26-29) at the Consecration: "This is My body, which will be given up for you." He elevates the Host above the altar for everyone to see. The priest genuflects, takes the chalice of wine, and goes again from the third person to the first, speaking as Christ: "THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD, THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COV-ENANT; WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME.. " He elevates the chalice, and he genu-

flects. Sincerely, Fr. Felician
