

The announcement that Jesus makes as he begins his preaching in today's Gospel is recalled on Ash Wednesday at the signing with ashes: "Repent and believe in the gospel." This is our challenge for Lent; indeed, it is the chal-

lenge of our entire life. During Lent, we are invited to strengthen and to renew the promises that we made at our Baptism, to reject Satan and sin so as to live as children of God. Through the grace of God that we received at Baptism, we follow the promptings of the Holy Spirit and know that with Jesus' help, we will be victorious over sin.

As you gather as a family, talk about the importance of Baptism. At our Baptism, our sins were forgiven, and we promised to live as children of God. As part of the Rite of Baptism, we rejected sin and Satan. Read today's Gospel, Mark 1:12-15. During Lent, we renew the promises of our Baptism, turning again from sin and promising to follow God. Light a candle, perhaps a candle used at one of your family member's Baptisms, and pray together the Act of Contrition.

#### "I am the bread of life." John 6:51

This week we continue with the Communion Rite of Mass. After the Priest (Celebrant) has consumed the consecrated Body and Blood of Christ, he then distributes Holy Communion to the Deacon, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, and the Altar Servers. Our ushers then begin to direct the congregation to come forward, in procession, forming in two lines, to receive the Holy Eucharist. It is important to note: Catholics can participate in Holy Communion if they're "properly disposed," which

- ☐ Are unaware of any mortal sins that aren't yet confessed and absolved.
- ☐ Don't publicly dissent from Church teaching, such as the Church's view on abortion.
- ☐ Fasted (not eating or drinking anything but water) for one full hour before receiving Holy Communion. The fast is one hour before Communion, not before the beginning of Mass.
- The Church asks that the following people not take Communion: ☐ Non Catholics
- ☐ Catholics in an invalid marriage.
- ☐ Catholics who've broken the one-hour fast (unless they're on medication, sick, elderly, or in the hospital).
- ☐ Catholics who haven't made their First Confession and First Communion.

When coming up to receive Holy Communion, we make an act of reverence prior to receiving. This may be done with a head bow, a genuflection, or kneeling. The priest, deacon or extraordinary minister of Holy Eucharist will hold the Eucharist up for you to see, and will say, "The Body of Christ." And we answer, "Amen." Receiving the Holy Eucharist on the tongue; however,

or on the palm of the hand is acceptable. If you choose to receive the Holy Eucharist in the palm of your hand, you consume it immediately. At no time should anyone walk away with the Holy Eucharist in their hand toward your pew (seat). Let's continue
