



At the conclusion of the reception of Holy Communion, the priest, deacon, and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion place their ciborium (the sacred vessel holding the Holy Eucharist) on the altar. The priest or deacon will then repose the remaining Holy Eucharist in the tabernacle. All empty sacred vessels, including the priest chalice, will be purified (cleaned) by either the priest or deacon with water, from the cruet, brought over from the credence table by the altar server. The water is poured into any empty ciborium and into the priest's chalice. It is then consumed by the priest or deacon. All the sacred vessels are then wiped and dried with a small white cloth called a purificator. At the conclusion of the reposition of the Holy Eucharist and the purification of the sacred vessels, the priest or deacon returns and sits in his chair, and the assembly also are seated at this time. The altar servers reverently approach the altar and take the Roman Missal (large red book containing all the prayers and order of the Mass) and it's gold stand, along with the priest's chalice, paten, pall, corporal and chalice veil and then, making a reverent head bow they return them to the credence table and side table. A brief moment of silent prayer is observed. Following the brief moment of silent prayer, the priest says, "Let us pray." The congregation stands and listens to the prayer after Communion. The congregation concludes the prayer by saying "Amen." The prayer after Communion concludes the Communion Rite. Next week we will conclude our reflection on the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, with the final part called the Concluding Rite. Sincerely, Father Felicjan
