3rd Sunday of Easter

Simon Peter, do you love me more than these?

By asking Peter, do you love me? Jesus reveals to us that our God is a God of love. He not only loves us but also wants us to love Him. There is no doubt that the apostles love Jesus, but their love was not strong enough to prevent them from returning to their former lifestyle. Since the Jesus they had believed in, did not prove to be the triumphant Messiah they had hoped for; they had to go back to the sea where they belong. But, having labored the entire night, the apostles who were professional fishermen could not catch any fish. One may begin to wonder whether there was no fish in the sea. ...It is not for lack of fish in the sea but for their lack of faith in God that they could not catch any fish.

The same Peter who denied Jesus three times now reaffirms his love for Jesus three times "*Yes, Lord, You know I love You.*" Jesus, in turn reminds Peter and those who always deny Jesus by their actions that true and sincere repentance consists not in a mere verbal affirmation of beliefs but in concrete actions expressed in the feeding of the poor and the needy. In the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, faith in the resurrection is kept alive. **The body of Christ which we eat at the Eucharistic table becomes both the food of everlasting life and the food that empowers us to bring life to others even now.** In celebrating and partaking of the Eucharist, the past, the present and the future is integrated into a timeless present. Eternity is now. Time ceases to exist, and it is in this timeless state that the mystery of our salvation is celebrated within a sacred space and time. Those who celebrate the Eucharist become exponentially bonded with the Divine. Like Peter have denied Jesus several times could make peace again with God by putting into practice the church's call to feed the hungry, clothe the naked and set prisoners free. This is what it means to be Easter people.

P.S. I go to Poland from May 12 to June 6 to visit my family, and especially to celebrate my father's 85th birthday in June. Please keep me in your prayers for a safe trip.

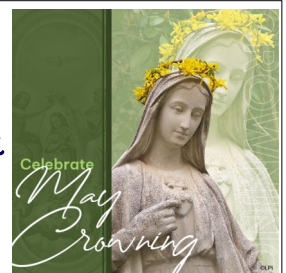

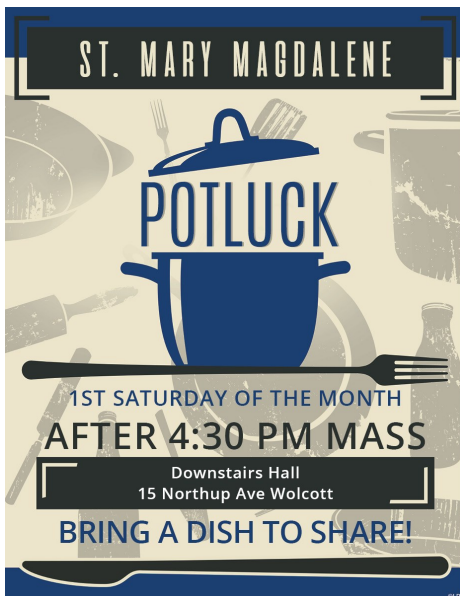

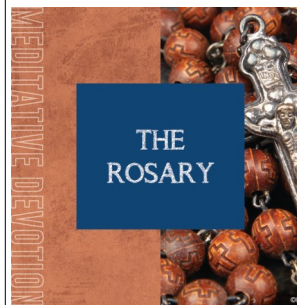

The Rosary, Explained

Christians have used beads to mark the recitation of prayers since ancient times. In the 12th century, the Rosary emerged as a meditative devotion centering on significant moments in the

lives of Jesus and Mary. In the words of St. Leo XIII, "there is no more excellent way of praying." The Rosary is traditionally attributed to a Marian vision received by St. Dominic de Guzman (1170-1221). Though scholarship on this point is uncertain, the Dominican Order was undoubtedly crucial in establishing and evangelizing the Rosary as a devotional prayer.

Over the centuries, the formula of the devotion eventually took the shape of 50 Hail Marys divided into five "decades," with each decade focused on a different mystery. The Church has defined the Joyful Mysteries (to be recited on Saturdays and Mondays), the Glorious Mysteries (Sundays and Wednesdays), the Sorrowful Mysteries (Tuesdays and Fridays), and most recently the Luminous Mysteries (to be recited on Thursdays).

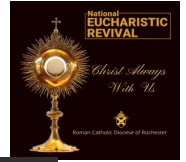

Let us begin to explore and reflect on the Sacrament of Confirmation. Many of us lack confidence when it comes to speaking to others about our faith in Jesus Christ. Jesus promised the apostles he would give them the courage needed to speak of him to others: *"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth"* (Acts 1:8). Jesus kept his promise. When they received the Holy Spirit, the apostles immediately went out to preach the good news. If they had any reluctance or fear, it was forgotten. *"When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. And suddenly there came from the sky a noise like a strong, driving wind, and it filled the entire house in which they were. Then there appeared to them tongues as of fire, which parted, and came to rest on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in different tongues, as the Spirit enabled them to proclaim."* (Acts 2:1-4) Christ fulfills his promise to us as well through the Sacrament of Confirmation. In Confirmation we receive courage and other gifts of the Holy Spirit that we need in order to be witnesses to Christ in our daily lives. We will continue our reflection on the Sacrament of Confirmation over the next several weeks.
