




## Live The Liturgy Inspiration of the Week

CONFIRMATION We continue to reflect on how the Sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated. Fol-

lowing a prayer for the sevenfold gift of the Holy Spirit, the bishop (or priest) dips his thumb in the Sacred Chrism (blessed oil), makes a sign of cross on the one to be confirmed, and prays: "[Name], be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit." Here, gift refers to the Holy Spirit. We are sealed with the gift of ("the gift that is") the Holy Spirit. Following the sacred anointing, the bishop (or priest) and the newly confirmed exchange a sign of peace. Anointing, in Biblical and other ancient symbolism, is rich in meaning: oil is a sign of abundance and joy; it cleanses (anointing before and after a bath) and limbers (the anointing of athletes and wrestlers); oil is a sign of healing, since it is soothing to bruises and wounds; and it makes radiant with beauty, health and strength." (CCC 1293) Anointing "signifies and imprints: a spiritual seal" that "marks our total belonging to Christ, our enrollment in his service forever (CCC 1293, 1296). Those confirmed "share more completely in the mission of Jesus Christ and the fullness of the Holy Spirit.....so that their lives may give off 'the aroma of Christ' (2 Corinthians 2:15)" (CCC 1294) Next week we will reflect on the Gifts of the Holy Spirit we receive in the Sacrament of Confirmation.
